## THE ELEVENTH ANNUAL BACH TAGE at Mount Olive

June 3/4, 2017

Bach Tage begins its second decade. Eleven years ago, a group of musicians and lovers of Bach's music gathered at Mount Olive, Minneapolis, for a unique conference combining learning and performance. Over a weekend, they studied, rehearsed, and performed a Bach cantata, with professional soloists and orchestra.

The goals of *Bach Tage* remain essentially the same. During these two very full days, participants acquire new skills for rehearsing, deepen their understanding of Bach's music and theology, are challenged to be better musicians, and make lasting friendships.

Expect the same experiences for yourself as we enter the second decade of this unique conference devoted to Bach and his music.

Bach Tage XI will focus on two lesser-known but exquisitely-beautiful cantatas:

BWV 6, Bleib bei uns, denn es will Abend werden! (Stay with Us, for Evening is Falling!)

BWV 68, Also hat Gott die Welt geliebt (For God has so Loved the World)

Cantata 6, for Easter Monday, and Cantata 68, for Whit Monday, were composed in the spring of 1725, Bach's second year in Leipzig. The cantatas share a beautiful, but unusual instrumental ensemble. Strings are joined by a trio of woodwinds, including the *Oboe da caccia*; the *Violoncello piccolo* is featured as well.

The Bach Tage orchestra players are all specialists in authentic performance of Baroque music, performing on historical-replica instruments.
