## Accent on Worship

### *Bishop Eaton's 2017 Christmas Message*

I was driving to work one day thinking about my schedule – the meetings I needed to attend, reports I needed to finish, preparations for upcoming travel, email, phone calls, and making a grocery list in my head so that I could pick up what I needed for supper on the way home from work. All of a sudden, I found myself pulling into the parking garage at the Lutheran Center. I had driven the 9 miles to work and had no idea how I got there. I didn't remember the traffic lights, the turns, the scenery – nothing. I had been so absorbed in what was coming up that I was completely oblivious to the present.

I think this experience is not unique to me. We set part of our lives on autopilot and set the planning, list-making, what-if scheduling part on overdrive. Now, planning is a good and necessary thing. One ought to be aware of what is coming up and what needs to be done, but I found that I was so driven by the contingencies and possibilities that I was everywhere all of the time, and, therefore, not anywhere at all.

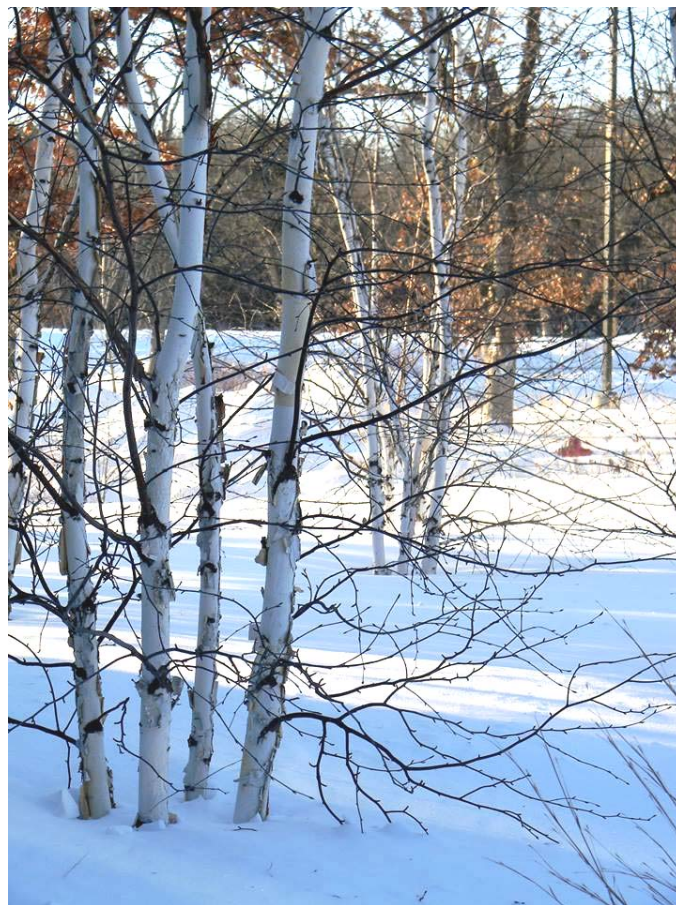
I asked my spiritual director about this, and she recommended that I meditate on these four words: "Just this. Just now." It's a simple discipline but not an easy one. It can alleviate all that anticipatory stress but only if we are willing to be still.

Here we are in Advent. This season doesn't exist in secular culture where everything is barreling toward Christmas. No time to wait, no time to notice, no time to be present. Not this. Not now. All of a sudden, we will find ourselves on the day after Christmas not knowing how we got there.

Advent is a holy season, a season that bids us to be present, to be still. So much is evoked in this season – hope, longing, and the bittersweet awareness that the world is beautiful and broken. Consider all of these things. Sit with them. Pray with them. Be aware of this time of great promise that comes, at least in the Northern Hemisphere, when night is longest. Come, Lord Jesus.

Wait for the Lord. Disengage the autopilot. Notice. Just this. Just now. Blessed Advent and merry Christmas, dear church!

## Summer of '17... Still With Us

No new title for this update having been brought forward this past fortnight, we're stuck with the old one. There's something to be said for continuity, of course; however, we can't continue this into the new year. Can we? Don't think caps promptly.

Heat is on at last, and working well. Tweaking of the system continues as well, and will for months to come.

The Community Meal moved back to the Undercroft Saturday December 16, and children shared the space that day decorating Christmas cookies. Undercroft is still a work "in process," however. On Monday, December 11, Vestry reviewed the construction budget, and the news is very good. We will finish this phase of work considerably under budget. As a result, Vestry approved a proposal to use some of the savings for painting and new lighting in the Undercroft.

So, beginning this week, painters will begin giving the whole downstairs a fresh new look. All the old lighting will also be replaced with modern LED fixtures and controls. The painters will also work in all four of the stairwells, patching walls and giving everything a fresh new coat of paint.

Look forward to a grand reopening, dedication, and tour of the downstairs in early January, including - yes - our amazing new high-tech boiler room.

### Angel Tree partnering with Pillsbury House + Theater

Pillsbury's social workers have referred families in serious need this season and we've connected with them to ease their burden and show them a blessing. Read their stories and pick an ornament (or two!) to provide real hope for these neighbors. Gifts include essentials like rent and gas cards to family outings and a tree.

Kytonia has three children 9, 7, and 5 years old. Her 7 year old daughter is battling cancer which demands almost daily treatment, meaning Kytonia is unable to work and must care for her sick child along with her others as well.

Ebony and her partner Quintin have two kids ages 5 and 2 and another girl on the way. Recently homeless this summer, Ebony is fighting to stay in her housing after Quintin fractured his vertebrae at work and she is only able to manage part time work.

If you're able, please pick an ornament with a request from either of these families and fulfill it by Sunday Dec 31. They are both needing help with rent, so if giving a cash/check donation, please either 1) use an offering envelope and designate it to "Angel tree;" 2) Slide it under my door in an envelope! 3) You can give cash or check to the fair trade sale and ask for it to go to "Angel Tree."
