Gratitude for three things

I began the Adult Forum this past Sunday (which I led) by identifying three things from the services that gave me cause for gratitude. I'll share them here too.

1. In both services last Sunday, the assembly included a large group of folks not usually here but who were here because of extended family activities. As I saw them, I thought to myself, "Please let them witness vibrancy and meaningfulness" (as opposed to witnessing apathy) – especially with the singing. I thought of the days of Rock Band playing, when

every evening began with that stretch of time when we began playing yet no one was on the dance floor. We waited for that moment when a brave couple would get up and start. Usually the floor filled up right away and stayed that way for the rest of the evening. We called that "someone breaking the ice" Singing can be like that – when some folks, even those who think they don't sing very well (God might not agree) sing out, it gives permission for everyone to join in without fear. That happened last Sunday– at both liturgies - even 8:00! For that, I was grateful.

2. We have children – in both services! As I listened to the sounds made by their wonderful sense of their world (both joy and pain), I smiled. There was a time when there were no such sounds and no children in our midst. They complete us. They are not the church of tomorrow, they are a vital part of the church of today. I'm grateful for parents who bring them, because the children are soaking in what is going on whether it looks like they are or not. It's no easy stretch of time for parents –their own ability to enter fully into the service changes during this time. You've got our support, and we love that they are a part of us!

3. When practicing on Saturday, the Swell shades on the organ quit working. This organ has been so reliable that it's rare when something doesn't work right. Downstairs was David Molvik (an organ technician and Mount Olive member) working on something else. I mentioned it to him, and up he came and started analyzing the problem. I had to leave but when I arrived Sunday morning it was fixed.

Severe Weather Team - can you help?
