Internship is a year of discernment. That is true for all vicars, but it is especially true of how I have approached my time here. I entered this year uncertain if I was headed towards parish ministry, further academic study, or something else entirely. From my first Sunday, I was immensely gratified by this community's openness to walking with me on my journey, wherever that might lead.

I'm excited to announce that I have decided on my next steps. After months of trying new things, listening for the Spirit, and testing my sense of call, I have decided not to continue pursuing ordained ministry at this time.

I want to be absolutely clear that this decision is not because of anything I have or have not experienced in this place. My time at Mount Olive has been nothing but a blessing. I love this place – its worship, its people, its community, its conscience. The support that I have received from Pastor Crippen, my internship committee, and the congregation as a whole has been superb. You have been more warm and affirming than I ever could have dreamed, and it's going to be very hard to leave when my term concludes in August. But as the months have gone by, it has become increasingly clear to me that,

even at a place as wonderful as this, professional ministry is not where my vocation lies. There are many, many things that I love about this work, but I do not feel called to it as a career. As difficult as it is to step away from this life path, I'm trusting that the Spirit is leading me elsewhere.

Instead, I will be heading back to Manhattan this fall to start law school at New York University. I don't yet know what kind of law I want to practice, but NYU is known for its emphasis on public service, and I am looking forward to discovering how I can use what I have learned here to serve the world in a different way. I'm not entirely sure what that will look like, but I know as surely as I know anything that I will always carry this year with me. You are a part of me now, and for that, I am grateful.

Vocation is a mysterious thing. I thank you all for your prayers, and will pray for you as you listen for where the Spirit is leading in your lives. All my love, *Vicar Jessica Christy*

# Mount Olive Tour at the State Capitol

On Sunday, July 22, at 1 p.m., Mount Olive members Lora Dundek and John Marty will offer a special tour of the Minnesota State Capitol, just for the congregation.

Lora works for the Minnesota Historical Society as a Capitol guide, and John is a State Senator representing the Roseville area. Together they will lead you through the building, highlighting the history, art, and government function represented there.

The Capitol is mostly accessible via elevator, with the exception of the "Quadriga" (golden horse statue) on the roof. It is not required that you climb to the Quadriga in order to participate in the rest of the tour.

There is no charge for the tour, but the Historical Society appreciates donations to support the Capitol historic work. The tour will last approximately 90 minutes. Many of you are supporters of our partner program The Sheridan Story, working to provide weekend meals to students to end child hunger. Each Friday a team from Mount Olive has gone to Jefferson Community School to put food bags in backpacks that make their way home with kids. This amazing program is wrapping up another school year and wants to say THANK YOU to all of its volunteers and contributors, as well as let you know what summer will hold since hunger doesn't take the summer off. If you are a contributing member, please look out for your donation renewal opportunity, or if you need any information on how to support the Sheridan Story for the upcoming 2018-2019 season please let Anna know. We will continue our financial support and service partnership with them to work to end child hunger!

The following is what The Sheridan Story does in the summer:

- Weekend food bags: The Sheridan Story provides our weekend food packs to students attending summer school in a number of school districts across the Twin Cities ·
- Minnesota Department of Education Migrant Schools: over 2,500 weekend food bags distributed to students participating in MDE's Migrant Education Summer School Programs in rural Minnesota.
- **Produce gardens and distributions:** The Sheridan Story collects produce from community gardens run by our friends at Surly and Dangerous Man breweries. The produce is then distributed to a number of students in the Minneapolis Public Schools from mid-July through September.
- **Community meal distribution** A pilot program every Saturday and Sunday we will serve lunch to children and youth at a Roseville park in coordination with a local church as part of the USDA's Summer Food Service Program.
