All the more . . .

The writer to the Hebrews says to us next Sunday, "Let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, . . . encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching." (10:24-25)

These are perilous times. Most generations of the Church who lived through such times where evil and cruelty and hatred not only exist but seem to thrive believed that it was a sign that the Day of the Lord was coming. The end times, the struggles Jesus said would happen near the end. After multiple generations of such hopes or fears, perhaps we can set that response aside. If The Day is near, we'll find out soon enough.

But we can take this exhortation from Hebrews and find possibilities for grace in the midst of the despair that pervades this world. We can – whether we think The Day is coming soon or don't think it ever will come – we can "consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds."

Because in the end love and good deeds are the way that the tide of evil is stemmed, and cruelty abated, and hatred disempowered. We know we

are in the arms of God's love, that the whole world is, that all God's children, every person, is dear to the Triune God and precious. In that undying love, let's consider how we might provoke one another to love and good deeds. Let us encourage one another to this, and "all the more," until the world is healed or the Day comes, trusting in God's Spirit who empowers all this and more in us.

Capital Appeal Nears Milestone at the End of November

The work from our Capital Appeal, Bold Step Forward, has been completed, and at the end of November we reach a major milestone: the construction loan will become our mortgage going forward.

Bold Step Forward was conceived as a 3-year fundraising campaign. This means that our fundraising is nearing the halfway point. To date, we have received more than \$750,000 of the \$1.1 million pledged. The balance of the cost of our construction (the new HVAC system which provides air conditioning in the nave, the renewed parking lot, the revisions to the Parish House entrance, and the replacement of sagging organ pipes) will become a 30-year mortgage that has a locked-in favorable rate.

All Bold Step Forward funds received by the end of November will reduce the size of the new mortgage. If you are considering a gift in 2018 toward Bold Step Forward, doing so by the end of November will be very helpful!
