## Accent on Worship

A good dumping of snow sure brings out the neighborhood. People are out in the early hours of the morning shoveling,

contemplating the cost-benefit of digging out their car to get where they need to go. Even from inside the rhythmic scrape of shovels down the sidewalk or the hum of snow blowers is a call to the rest of the block to bundle up and get the job done. It's rather interesting to me that I see more of my neighbors on a snowy morning than I would on a lovely summer day. We smile and greet one another with an understanding chuckle at our collective struggle. The motivation of communal accountability is a marvelous thing. It gets sidewalks shoveled in subzero temperatures. It grows community gardens. It can build or tear down walls, businesses, churches.

Right now the Longer Table Lending team is still in the pursuit of creating a program that offers no-interest loans to people in a financial need. Throughout this long, arduous process, there have been moments of great pride as well as lows of frustration. Standing from a new vantage point as I prepare to take this work from inside the office to my home, I've been reflecting on the larger picture of what is at work. What keeps us at the table? What pushes us to keep scheduling the meetings and making the calls and moving it all forward when sometimes it feels like we're just bouncing against walls far bigger than we can climb over?

I found my answer in a snowy sidewalk. It's ridiculous really, to go outside in freezing temperatures while the sun still hides and the wind whips around to clear a driveway and a sidewalk. But I feel responsible – not only to myself and my family, but to my neighbors. It is communal accountability that drives so much of our behavior for better or worse. The way we obey traffic laws, the way we give to our church community, the way we interact (or not) with the views of others around us are all held within a sacred web of connection. We are building Longer Table because we are pulled by a force deeply embedded in a sense of love and connection that, when released whole-heartedly, can be a scary beautiful powerful thing. Just like how Mount Olive was created. Just how our many dreams to come will draw us out on wintry mornings or for evening meetings to come together and do something wonderful.
