Grafted into the Mystical Body of Christ

Since the early centuries of the church, the time of Lent, the Forty Days, has been a time of preparation for baptism, and, for those who are already baptized, a time of growing more deeply into the baptismal life through the work of the Spirit.

Baptism was seen in a variety of ways by the early writers in the Christian church. We might usually think of it as a washing, a bath, for forgiveness and purity. About 150 C.E., Justin called baptism “the Illumination,” because through it one's spirit was filled with light. John Chrysostom called baptism, “a smelting furnace” that molds us into new vessels,

and also a drowning. Cyril of Jerusalem thought of entering the waters of baptism as entering the waters of the womb to emerge in a new birth. Theodore of Mopsuestia, drawing on Paul, called it a death and arising to new life in Christ, the three immersions symbolizing Christ's three days in the tomb.

Irenaeus of Lyons (ca. 130 C.E.) and others considered baptism to be a grafting into Christ the Vine, into the mystical body of Christ, into the family of the beloved of God. The baptized are grafted into the True Vine, connected not only to the Vine, but to each other through the work of the Spirit. Irenaeus writes: “[Christ] promised to send the Comforter, who would join us to God... Just as dry wheat without moisture cannot make a single mass of dough or a single loaf, so we who are many could not be made one in Christ Jesus without the water from heaven. And just as dry earth, if it does not receive moisture, does not bear fruit, so we, who at first were a dry tree, could never have borne the fruit of life without the free-flowing rain from above.”

May this Lententide water us with the free-flowing rain from above.
