## Accent on Worship

*"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." John 14:27*

Worldly peace seems to be something we seek by eliminating the unpeaceful: Peace is quiet, not noisy. Peace is calm, not rowdy or full of anxiety. Peace is beautiful and harmonious, not garish. Peace is non-violent.

These and other ways we strive for peace in our world are well and good. But, like most worldly things, some kinds of peace are more available to the privileged. I can choose to enjoy much worldly peace: I am far away from war and violence, but some of our neighbors fear for safety. I don't ever worry about my next meal, or if I'll have shelter each night, but some of our neighbors are begging for these basic necessities.

I find peace and comfort sometimes by sitting quietly, other times by listening to music, and other times eliminating distractions to enjoy the beauty of nature, art, or a good cup of coffee. You may find peace in similar or different ways, but in each of these cases we're each making a judgement on what is to be cast out in favor of what brings us peace.

Are we casting out those who need Jesus' peace in order to make our own worldly peaceful spaces?

Jesus says "my peace I give to you." As Paul said, Jesus' peace is a peace surpassing understanding. This peace is the best kind of gift as he prepared his friends for his Ascension. They did not ask for this gift, nor did they earn it, nor will it ever run out, it gives both calm and courage, and is just what they (and we) always needed. In worship, we practice sharing peace within the few pews around us in the sanctuary. Like the apostles, let us practice sharing Jesus' peace with everyone, everywhere we go.

The peace of Christ be with you all.

## Taking Heart: Ramadan Iftar Open House Meals 2019

From the Minnesota Council of Churches (with an invitation from Jim Bargmann, Coordinator of Neighborhood Ministry):

Ramadan is the month of the Islamic lunar calendar during which Muslims abstain from food and drink from sunrise to sunset; in 2019 it falls between the dates of May 5 - June 4. Fasting during Ramadan is one of the "five pillars" of Islam, and is performed to learn compassion, self-restraint, and generosity.

Taking Heart Open Houses is a long-running program coordinated by the Minnesota Council of Churches (MCC) and the Muslim American Society of Minnesota (MAS-MN) to bring Christians and members of other faith communities together with Muslims for food and conversation during Ramadan. Minnesota mosques and Islamic community centers welcome their non-Muslim neighbors for a traditional Iftar, inviting a time of encounter and learning.

## New Mount Olive Housing Task Force

It began with a vision! At last fall's Vestry retreat, when asked to imagine standing in from of Mount Olive in 10 years and look north, about half the vestry saw some kind of affordable housing effort for low-income people as part of our ministry. This vision became part of Pastor Crippen's Stewardship sermon last fall when he asked us to listen to the Holy Spirit in our giving - not to what we need for our current ministry, but in faithful sacrifice that opens the door to be of more service to the poor and needy. The Vestry has discussed about how best to achieve these visions and this stirring of the Spirit.

The Vestry has formed a Housing Task Force to investigate low income affordable housing as a need in our community, to survey what other efforts are already being made to address this issue, and to recommend to the Vestry a plan of how Mount Olive might use its resources to expand our ministry in this way.
