Hosea 1:2-10 Psalm 85 Colossians 2:6-15[16-19] Luke 11:1-13 Sometimes God asks us to do strange things.

In the case of Hosea, God asks him to marry a prostitute. Hosea chooses a woman named Gomar and God gives further instruction in regards to their children. First, their son: "Name him Jezreel," meaning "he sows." The their first daughter, God instructs Hosea to name Lo-ruhamah, meaning, "not pitied." And their third child, also given a name chosen by God, Lo-ammi, or "Not my people."

My children are named Nathan (God gives) and Elizabeth (God is an oath or promise). I cannot fathom naming my beloved child, "not my people."

Poor Hosea. He was called into the life of a prophet, and as such, God used his life as an illustration for the message God was attempting to send to the people of Israel.

Sometimes God asks us to do strange things. Likely, no one in this community has been called to marry a prostitute. But I know there are members of this community who have given of their time and ability to fight prostitution on Lake Street. I know there are members of this community who give of their time and money to share hot meals with those who would

otherwise go without. Some of you travel halfway around the world on a regular basis to teach and encourage those who are doing God's work in other countries. And some who simply share a bottle of cold water or a cup of coffee - and a listening ear. There are countless acts of love and service done by members of this community in the name of God that may seem strange. The reality is this: even if we are not asked to marry a prostitute and give our children strange names, we are all called by God to do sometimes strange things - things that don't make sense. But God uses those seemingly simple but strange actions as a way to share a message of love - God's own love coming through a simple but strange actions.

Keep listening to God - and be willing to act when you are asked to do strange things.

Grab your coffee and stay for a showing of the National Geographic's powerful film, "Paris to Pittsburgh," a testament to what individuals, cities and states are doing to fight climate change despite our president's withdrawal from the Paris Accords. Together as cities and states we can have a real impact on reducing carbon emissions. We need to keep working, keep expanding our efforts, keep up the vocal pressure. 
