The Singing Assembly

I've always liked the phrase "Dance like no one can see you" – and I suppose one could say the same about singing. The phrase implies a complete letting go of inhibition, with the fear of what it might sound or look like to others not a part of the mix. Would that all of us could be that way even when others can see and hear us!

Watching a soloist let go, however, is fun – and many of us might even feel a bit of envy. The full release of energy/emotion has to be cleansing. But I can't sound like Placido Domingo, or even an-octave-lower Barbara Streisand. Singing in worship is different – because we don't do it solo. When singing collectively we can let go so much more, and we do because we are not subject to judgment.

This is what I love about the assemblies at Mount Olive. Anyone can come and be a part of the assembly, singer and non-singer alike, sing out, and sing like "no one is watching or hearing." It's a huge release of energy, meaningfulness, and a complete "letting go."

Here's something to consider about our singing: because we sing like we do, we can and perhaps are called to sing things that might not work everywhere. Sometimes this singing involves being able to read music which is not an ability that everyone has. Sometimes we chant Psalms with a system that not many other churches use for the assembly. In these cases, it's the responsibility of those who read music, and those who have been here before and know what to do to step up to the plate and help "a little more" – to carry those in the learning stages (and be patient!). I feel it to be a duty and delight thing – an important one.

Sometimes instructions for singing may seem a bit vague. You can blame me for this. Over the years, I've learned that in many cases, the more instructions provided in the service folder, the more confused folks can get. Two scenarios come to mind: 1. When we sing in canon. Directions could say "at the measure" and be really specific about identifying groups (as in pews 1-5) and when they should sing. We might just say, "sung in canon; sing a part in need of your voice." Folks who know what to do there will do it, and that will be very clear for those who are a little confused. Example is a much better leader than instructional rubrics. *(continued on page 4)*

2. The other is Psalmody. Fewer instructions, and relying on the help of those who do know what to do works far more invitingly.

A scenario for diminishing our singing potential would be to plan as if no one has been here before, to plan as if no one reads music (many more do than most churches assume), or to plan as if there are no memory banks informing participation. The limitations would be huge and the song - - well, not much.

Certainly we planners do not want to plan over the heads of every anticipated assembly, but when and if the expectation includes the help of memory, experience, and music reading, and these abilities are called upon, more doors are opened to what we can sing.

For those of you who know this and accept the challenge to provide the help, on behalf of our assemblies and on behalf of those of us who plan what possibilities are for singing - thank you.

2019 ELCA Global Mission Spotlight: Karen Anderson and EPES (Chile)

As a Lutheran missionary in Chile from 1982–2000, Karen Anderson founded and directed EPES, **Educación Popular en Salud**. EPES has worked to build a sustainable health care organization dedicated to promoting the health, dignity and rights of poor people in Chile and throughout the region through education, empowerment and collective action.

In 2009, she returned as an ELCA missionary to help the EPES staff design, launch and direct EPES' International Training Course on Popular Education in Health which, among other important tasks, explores the role of the church in the struggle for health and human rights. **In the past ten years, the International Training program has had 187 participants from 25 countries, including participants from eleven Lutheran churches from other Latin American countries.** In the past three years, EPES' work has expanded to Africa as participants from Kenya, Uganda, Zimbabwe, Tanzania, Senegal, Madagascar and Ethiopia have participated in the International Training Course. Upon returning home, they have been implementing EPES training model in their local communities.

Your gifts to ELCA Global Mission help more than 225 ELCA missionaries, including Karen Anderson, serve "hand in hand" with companion churches in almost 50 countries.
