# Accent on Worship Pastor Joseph Crippen

What's the deal with St. Michael? Sunday at Mount Olive we will step away from the regular Sunday lectionary and celebrate what our Church calendar calls a

"lesser" festival: the feast day of St. Michael and All Angels. This has been our practice here for well over two decades, and probably longer. Since not all might be familiar with this part of the Church year calendar, it seems worth a bit of explanation.

The Lutheran calendar we follow is readily accessible: the brief overview is on pages 14-17 in the front of the pew editions of *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*, our red worship books. Starting on page 18 are the "propers" for each day (prayer of the day and readings). The first section is the regular Sunday propers for all three lectionary years, including the six major festivals (called "principal" festivals in *ELW*). The major festivals are Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, Holy Trinity. We celebrate these days on whatever calendar day they land (half are always on a Sunday.)

The lesser festivals are listed on pp. 15-17 in small capital letters. These are feast days mostly celebrating the apostles and other biblical saints, and some significant events such as Mary's visit to Elizabeth, and the death of the innocents at Bethlehem. At Mount Olive, our practice is that if one of these lesser festivals occurs on a green Sunday (we don't override the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter), we celebrate

it, and use the scheduled propers for that day. These propers are listed beginning on page 54, and are organized by date. In addition, there are several lesser festivals – the Presentation, Mary, mother of our Lord, Holy Cross, St. Francis – that we celebrate yearly regardless of whether they're on a Sunday that year.

The "commemorations" on our calendar are saints and holy people throughout history that the church has recognized but who aren't part of that first generation of biblical witnesses. We remember these names on Sundays in our intercessory prayers. Our Lutheran calendar is similar to other Western calendars, such as the Roman and the Anglican, with occasional differences, and sometimes is similar to the Eastern calendars. But that still leaves the question: why a feast day for Michael and all angels? Well, there are resources to explain the history of this particular day which I'd be glad to loan for those curious. And you can always come Sunday and see if the sermon sorts that out for you in a way that makes sense.

## Bethlehem Besieged

Following her presentation at the Adult Forum, Jo Lucas gave us a copy of Mitri Raheb's short book Bethlehem Besieged, Stories of *Hope in Times of Trouble.* The book is now in our library, giving you the chance to learn the history behind Bright Stars of Bethlehem, our newest mission partner. The work began at Christmas Lutheran Church in Bethlehem and has now expanded into the Diyar Consortium. The Consortium includes the k-12 Dar al-Kalima School, the Dar al-Kalima University College, the Health and Wellness Center, International Center of Bethlehem, Guesthouse, and the dining room and art galleries. All of these programs are designed to bring hope to the Palestine and Christian population while working for a life of peace between Palestinians and Israelis. As Dr. Rahib concludes, "Holding to a hopeful vision in the context of war gives hope a new meaning. It is no longer something we see but rather something we practice, something we live, something we advocate, something we plant."

#### News From the Neighborhood

#### Diaper Depot Help Needed

We are looking to expand our volunteer corps for the Diaper Depot.

We are one of a very few organizations that provide young families with low-cost diapers for their little ones. As word has spread, we have seen a significant increase in the number of families we serve.

With this increase, the number of diapers we need to process on a weekly basis has increased significantly, and the need for more workers is apparent.

There are two ways you can be of service in the Diaper Depot.

First, we are looking for volunteers to pack diapers. Our current volunteers often pack diapers on Tuesdays during the day, either before or after noon Bible study.

Second, we are looking for more people to work the hours the Diaper Depot is open, 4:00 to 6:00 pm on Tuesdays and on the first and third Saturdays (the same weeks as the Community Meal), 11:00 am to 1:00 pm. Volunteers working the Diaper Depot will help our clients by packing up the needed diapers, checking out their purchases, and registering new clients.

For both roles, training would be provided and volunteer will be put on a rotating schedule with other volunteers. Time commitment is flexible - volunteers could serve once a week or once a month or any amount of time in between.
