Focus on the Season: Good Friday, the Way of the Cross

The devotion known as the Way of the Cross is an adaptation to local usage of a custom widely observed by pilgrims to Jerusalem: the offering of prayer at a series of places in that city traditionally associated with our Lord's passion and death. It would be appropriate to gather today at noon, the hour of our Lord Jesus' crucifixion, and walk with him to his cross and burial.

However, you can also print these pages and use the links in the email. Each station has its own link, plus the opening and closing are on their own links. READING

(Mark 15:1, 14:64b; John 19:13, 16)

- Ⓘ As soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes, and the whole council. They bound Jesus, led him away and handed him over to Pilate. And they all condemned him as deserving death. When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus outside and sat down on the judgment seat at a place called the Stone Pavement, or in Hebrew, *Gabbatha*. Then he handed Jesus over to them to be crucified.
- Ⓘ For this I was born, and for this I came into the world,
- ☛ **to testify to the truth.** (John 18:37)

- Ⓘ Let us pray. *(brief silence)*

READING

(John 19:17; Hebrews 5:8; Isaiah 53:7b; Revelation 5:12)

- ☐ Jesus went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called the Place of a Skull, which in Hebrew, is called *Golgotha*. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered. Like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and blessing.
- ☐ The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance:
- ☑ Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. *(1 Timothy 1:15)*

PRAYER

- ☐ Let us pray. *(brief silence)*

Merciful God, in Christ you set aside your power and took up the cross to show us the power of your love. Give us courage to take up our cross and follow your Christ; and grant that we, walking in the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord.

READING

(Lamentations 2:13; Matthew 5:4; Isaiah 60:20b)

- ☐ What can I say for you, to what can I compare you, O daughter of Jerusalem? To what can I liken you, that I may comfort you, O virgin daughter of Zion? For vast as the sea is your ruin. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. The Lord will be your everlasting light, and your days of mourning will be ended.
- ☐ This child is destined for the falling and rising of many,
- ☑ **and a sword will pierce your own soul also.** (*Luke 2:34-35*)

PRAYER

- ☐ Let us pray. (*brief silence*)

O God of consolation, Mary, the mother of Jesus, stood in loving sorrow and pain at the foot of his cross, faithful to the end, pondering these things in her heart. So shape us that we, with Mary, participate in your love for the world, and in compassion stand with all those in affliction and suffering, through the same Jesus Christ our Lord.

READING

(*Luke 23:26; Matthew 16:24, 11:29a, 30*)

- Ⓐ As they led Jesus away, they seized a man, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, and they laid the cross on him, and made him carry it behind Jesus. “If any want to be my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.”
- Ⓐ Whoever serves me must follow me,
- ☑ **and where I am, there will my servant be also.** (*John 12:26*)

PRAYER

- Ⓐ Let us pray. (*brief silence*)

Heavenly Father, whose blessed Son came not to be served but to serve: Bless all who, following in his steps, give themselves to the service of others. As Simon took on the burden of the cross for Jesus, give us the willingness to share the burdens of all who are heavy-laden and weary of heart, walking the stony road with them; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

READING

(*Luke 23:27-28*)

- ☐ A great number of people followed after Jesus, and among them were women who were beating their breasts and wailing for him. But Jesus turned to them and said, “Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children.”
- ☐ Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road is easy that leads to destruction,
- ☑ **and the gate is narrow and the road is hard that leads to life.** (*Matthew 7:13*)


PRAYER

- 📖 even death on the cross. *(Philippians 2:8)*

READING

(Matthew 27:33-34, 35b; John 19:24b)

- 📖 When they came to the place called Golgotha, they offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. And they divided his clothes among them by casting lots. This was to fulfill what the scripture says, “They divided my clothes among themselves; for my clothing they cast lots.”
- 📖 Take no gold, or silver, or copper in your belts;
- 📖 no bag for your journey, or two tunics, or sandals, or a staff. *(Matthew 10:9-10)*

PRAYER

- 📖 Let us pray. *(brief silence)*

God of abundance, in Christ Jesus you released all and became empty for the sake of the world. So strengthen us in trust of your goodness and love, that, following the example of Christ, we may also release all our grasping and clinging to the things of this world; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord.

(Luke 23:33; Mark 15:28)

☐ At Golgotha, the Place of the Skull, they crucified Jesus, and with him they crucified two criminals, one on his right, the other on his left. And the scripture was fulfilled that said, “He was counted among the lawless.”

☐ I am the way, and the truth, and the life.

☑ No one comes to the Father except through me.

(John 14:6)

PRAYER

☐ Let us pray. *(brief silence)*

All-gracious God, in Christ you stretched out your arms of love on the hard wood of the cross that everyone might come within the reach of your saving embrace. So clothe us in your Spirit that we, opening wide our hands in love, may bear your encircling love to all people; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord.

- ☑ even death on the cross. *(Philippians 2:8)*

READING

(John 19:26-27a, 30; Luke 23:46a; John 19:30b)

- ☐ When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, “Woman, here is your son.” Then he said to the disciple, “Here is your mother.” After Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, “It is finished!” Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, “Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.” Then he bowed his head, and gave up his spirit.
- ☐ I tell you the truth, unless a grain of wheat dies, it remains just a single grain;
- ☑ but if it dies, it bears much fruit. *(John 12:24)*

PRAYER

- ☐ Let us pray. *(brief silence)*

God of wisdom, who creates all things new, out from the tree of the cross a new vine grows forth, shading the faint and sheltering the fearful under the embracing arms of your loving Christ. Give us courage to daily commit our spirits into your loving care, that our hearts may ever sing in eternal gratitude; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstfruit of the dead.

(Luke 23:50a, 51b; Matthew 27:57c-60)

☐ When it was evening, there came a good and righteous man named Joseph, from the town of Arimathea, who also was a disciple of Jesus and was waiting expectantly for the kingdom of God. He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus, and Pilate ordered it to be given to him. So Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn in the rock; and he rolled a great stone to the door of the tomb.

☐ Blessed are the pure in heart,

☑ for they shall see God.

(Matthew 5:8)
