The Gospel reading for today is her song, called the Magnificat, where she sings with grace about God’s lifting up those who are cast down and feeding those who are hungry, the new age of God’s healing that her son, Jesus the Christ, would initiate.

Paul writes: ⁴ But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, ⁵ in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. ⁶ And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, “Abba! Father!” ⁷ So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.
