
Night Prayer Compline

Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

The leader begins the confession. All join in on the bold print.

Holy and gracious God,

I confess that I have sinned against you this day. Some of my sin I know — the thoughts and words and deeds of which I am ashamed — but some is known only to you. In the name of Jesus Christ I ask forgiveness. Deliver and restore me, that I may rest in peace.

By the mercy of God we are united with Jesus Christ, in whom we are forgiven. We rest now in the peace of Christ and rise in the morning to serve.

⁸ In peace, I will lie | down and sleep; * for you alone, O LORD, make me | rest secure.







There will be no more night; the servants of God need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.


The reading of scripture is followed by extended silence for reflection and meditation. The silence concludes with the following responsory. All sing on the bold print responses.






Gospel Canticle for Compline - The Nunc Dimittis


The leader sings the first two lines; all sing the rest.






