

## Accent on Worship

### ***Samuel's Call***

*Begin with reading 1 Samuel 3:1-20.*

Samuel's call to ministry is risky and it is bold.

Samuel is sleeping in the temple where he works. Suddenly he hears a voice calling his name. He mistakenly assumes that this is the voice of his boss, Eli. Eager to provide care for his boss, he goes to his side but is turned away—Eli did not call him. Then Samuel is called again and he returns to Eli's side. Eli informs him that he did not call him and tells him that if the voice calls out again to respond with "speak, LORD, for your servant is listening."

So Samuel lays back down and soon he hears the voice calling out again and proclaims, "speak, LORD, for your servant is listening."

God speaks to Samuel, but it probably isn't a message Samuel wants to hear. God's message to Samuel is a message of judgement against Eli because Eli and his family have abused their positions of power and oppressed vulnerable people in their community.

This message shakes Samuel and it keeps him awake all night long. In the morning, Eli calls for Samuel and asks him what he heard. Samuel was hesitant to share the vision.

Imagine how difficult it must have been to be in Samuel's shoes and to hear about the judgement that is going to happen to someone you care about. Eli is a mentor to Samuel.

Yet, Samuel boldly proclaims what he heard from God and speaks God's truth to power.

We learn from Samuel that speaking truth to power includes speaking truth to the power that has nurtured us. Speaking truth to power includes speaking truth to the people whom we love. Speaking truth to power includes speaking truth that challenges our very own ways of operating in society.

We also learn from Eli. For if we are in positions of power and privilege, we like Eli also must be willing to listen to how God is speaking to us through our community. Eli was open to hearing the truth, even if it was not the message he wanted to hear.

Just one week ago when the insurrection took place at our Capital, we were reminded again of our calling to speak to truth to power for the sake of our world and our neighbors. We must be bold and we must take risks. We must also listen.

Samuel's call story emphasizes how God is calling us now.

Read 1 Samuel 3:1-20 again and ask yourself: How will I listen? How will I speak?

## Stewardship News

Thank you everyone for your compassion and commitment to Mount Olive. We want to make the process of supporting our church financially easy and convenient for everyone. If you are okay with the delay in the deposit posting to your account, please feel free to continue sending your offering via US mail. If you would like, we have alternative methods for giving that you may want to consider:

- **Bill Pay:** You can set up a regular offering through your bank by calling and talking to someone or by logging in online. You tell your bank how much to send, how often and they will electronically transfer the amount. This service is most often free of charge and already used by many at Mount Olive.

- **Electronic Funds Transfer:** Set up a regular deduction from your bank account through the church's existing account with Vanco Services. Contact the church office to set this up and a form will be mailed or emailed to you. Complete the form and send it back to the church office either by US mail or via email.

- **Mount Olive Website:** You can donate by credit card through the church website. Visit our site [www.mountolivechurch.org](http://www.mountolivechurch.org), go the very bottom of the home page and a "Donate" link is on the left. This method is good for one-time donations rather than recurring donations as the fees charged to Mount Olive per transaction are higher than the other two methods.

## Building Our Home



Building Our Home is an initiative of Mount Olive, building on the work of our Housing Task Force, that seeks to build our home, the Twin Cities, as we literally build homes for the most vulnerable in our community. Partnering with three non-profit developers, Building Our Home will leverage the resources of congregations, individuals, and community organizations to build over 2100 units of affordable and supportive housing.

### *The Initiative*

Though the work of our housing task force, Mount Olive has existing relationships with three non-profit affordable housing developers, Beacon Interfaith, Aeon, and Alliance Housing. Each of these organizations has a list of in-progress projects awaiting funding. Private donations and money from the State of Minnesota through bonding are two of the most significant sources of funding for affordable housing.

The total funding goal for Building Our Home is 21.3 million dollars. Though our Neighborhood Ministry leadership, Mount Olive is seeking partnerships with its Twin Cities sister congregations of the Evangelical Church of America, along with other faith communities, organizations, and individuals.

In addition to opportunities to participate financially, there will be opportunities for members to participate in advocacy work with our elected leaders.

### *The Ask*

For you, Mount Olive family, there are two primary ways for you to get involved in Building Our Home.

First, financially. We have set a goal of finding 26,000 individuals, representing the active membership of our 252 Twin Cities ELCA sister congregations, to donate to this effort. With this number of participants, we would reach our goal with a donation of \$338 per person. Over the next year, are you able to contribute \$338 per person in your family? If so, you can go to the Mount Olive web site and on the donation page, we have set up a dedicated account for Building Our Home. If you prefer to send a physical check, your offering envelope pack contains a special pink Neighborhood Ministry Offering envelope. If you use this envelope, and mark the Housing Support line, your donation will go toward this effort. If you are not able to contribute this amount, consider an amount that works for you - even \$1 or \$10 or \$20. Many hands make light work of a large goal.

Second, talk to others about this effort. Many in the Twin Cities have expressed concern about the lack of affordable housing for our most vulnerable. We are looking for support from individuals, businesses, really anyone who has a passion for helping ensure others have safe, affordable housing.

Housing is one key piece in helping address many of our society's most pressing issues from racial inequality to economic insecurity to violence and crime prevention. This initiative will have a big impact on the availability of affordable housing in our home.
