At this time, all worship services and activities are being conducted online, not by gathering, in the interests of the health of our members, our neighborhood, and the world around us.

This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. — John 15:12

Jesus' commandment to love one another is once again a central theme in our lectionary readings for this Sunday. As much as it is a commandment and central to our identity of Christians, it is also an invitation as we discern what it means to be neighbors to and for each other.

There is no doubt in mind that each of us have been challenged to love at times when it has been hard to extend love and grace. Maybe it was easier to just look the other way? Or maybe our cup was full and we didn't feel like we had any-thing left to offer? Or maybe we were having a bad day?

I've often felt guilt when I haven't loved the way Jesus commands, but I have to remind myself that I am also constantly in need of the Triune God's unconditional love and grace that has been poured out for each and every one of us.

One way that I have stayed grounded in God's love, grace, and healing over the past two months has been through participating in the online community, Healing Our City\*. It is a time of daily prayer and reflection that has helped to ground me in God's love and my calling to enact God's love in our community through my daily actions.

What are things that ground you? Things in your daily life that remind you of God's love for you and our calling to extend love to all of our neighbors? If you struggling to think of something, know that God's encompassing love holds you and guides you.

We will continue to follow Jesus' commandment and invitation to love, together.

# Gardening Inspiration from Chile

"In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, the EPES Foundation (our mission partner in Chile with missionary Karen Anderson) initiated a project with community health promoters and nutrition teams to cultivate home gardens. In five months, the women transformed the patios and balconies of their homes into small vegetable gardens. The enthusiasm for what was learned and harvested during the months of strict quarantine was so great that the women decided to create a community garden at the end of that year. The Auco community center in the Oscar Bonilla neighborhood of El Bosque, where the David Werner health team has met for more than 25 years, was chosen as the place for the community garden.

"In this video, the women share their experiences related to creating the garden, highlighting the satisfaction of growing their own food, connecting with nature, promoting community participation in health and food sovereignty, and contributing to the environment by reducing organic waste. In addition, they report how this collective learning process has helped them to better face the pandemic, strengthening ties between women, sowing hope and cultivating solidarity."

# Stewardship News

Thank you everyone for your compassion and commitment to Mount Olive. We want to make the process of supporting our church financially easy and convenient for everyone. If you are okay with the delay in the deposit posting to your account, please feel free to continue sending your offering via US mail. If you would like, we have alternative methods for giving that you may want to consider:

• Bill Pay: You can set up a regular offering through your bank by calling and talking to someone or by logging in online. You tell your bank how much to send, how often and they will electronically transfer the amount. This service is most often free of charge and already used by many at Mount Olive.

- Electronic Funds Transfer: Set up a regular deduction from your bank account through the church's existing account with Vanco Services. Contact the church office to set this up and a form will be mailed or emailed to you. Complete the form and send it back to the church office either by US mail or via email.
- Mount Olive Website: You can donate by credit card through the church website. Visit our site <a href="https://www.mountolivechurch.org">www.mountolivechurch.org</a>, go the very bottom of the home page and a "Donate" link is on the left. This method is good for one-time donations rather than recurring donations as the fees charged to Mount Olive per transaction are higher than the other two methods.



# Building Our Home

The series highlighting some of the specific properties that will be funded in part by the Building Our Home initiative continues this week. It is hoped that this will make the work more concrete (literally and figuratively).

Please note, a glossary of some basic terms will be included at the end of this section for each week of this series since there are some terms used in the property descriptions that may not be familiar to all readers. This section will repeat each week.

Lydia Apartments were originally build Beacon Interfaith in 2003, providing 40 units of much needed affordable and supportive housing to the Stevens Neighborhood of south Minneapolis. Now, they are moving forward with doubling the size of Lydia Apartments by adding a six story addition to the north side of the existing building. Lydia Apartments currently house people with a history of homelessness and mental health challenges, and that will not change with the expansion. Lydia provides on-site services and case management for all residents, epitomizing the best of supportive housing. This expansion is a part of the Building Our Home initiative.

### Commonly Used Terms and Abbreviations

**AMI:** Average Median Income; the average amount made by households in a given area; currently, the AMI for the Twin Cities metro area for a family of four is \$103,400 (one earner making \$49.71 per hour). As one example, 30% AMI, often a measure of housing considered to be the most affordable, would be \$31,000 (one earner making \$14.90 per hour), making a three-bedroom apartment affordable at \$806 per month. For comparison, the average rent for a three-bedroom unit in the Twin Cities in 2019 was \$1,624.

**Affordable Housing:** Defined as housing that can be obtained and maintained for 30% or less of a households' monthly income. By definition, housing costs include all costs related to maintaining a home - utilities, trash disposal, insurance, and the like - not just rent or mortgage.

**Supportive Housing:** Affordable, long-term, community-based housing with on-site support services such as employment counseling, addiction recovery support, etc. for people with multiple barriers to getting and keeping housing.

### The Initiative

Working with three non-profit affordable housing developers, Beacon Interfaith, Aeon, and Alliance Housing, Mount Olive is working to build over 2100 units of affordable and supportive housing with a funding goal of 21.3 million dollars. Through our Neighborhood Ministry leadership, Mount Olive is seeking partnerships with its Twin Cities sister congregations of the Evangelical Church of America, along with other faith communities, organizations, and individuals.
