



Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Mount Olive is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. It is a community in and of the city where all are welcome in every aspect of congregational life. We believe that worship is central to our life together, that our weekly gathering around Word and Sacrament strengthens us for our work as people of God in this and in every place.

An elevator to the lower and street levels can be found at the northwest corner of the education wing. Restrooms are located on the main floor and lower level. Turn right as you exit the narthex, then turn left. Restrooms are at the end of the hall, next to the elevator. Please ask an usher if you need assistance!

Mount Olive is equipped with a hearing assist loop. If you use a hearing aid equipped with a T-Coil, switch your device to T-Coil to access. If your aid does not have that option, small headsets are available. Ask an usher for assistance.

Helps for following the liturgy: Numbers marked with the word “page...” in small case are in the front portion of the hymnal at the bottom left and right corners of the page. Numbers marked with the word “HYMN...” are in the back portion of the hymnal in the upper left and right corners of the page. Note that the psalms are numbered as hymns 1-150.

Please remain masked and keep social distancing in the nave. We welcome everyone to coffee hour after worship. For the protection of children and unvaccinated adults, please wear mask as much as possible while enjoying coffee and conversation.

Focus on the Season: St. James, Apostle

James and his brother John were the sons of Zebedee, fishermen by trade before their call from Jesus. They left all that they had known and the future they had prepared for to follow Jesus on a path they couldn't predict. When during that journey they asked Jesus for the places of honor in the coming kingdom, Jesus knew that once again they didn't know what they were in for. Yet James did indeed drink from the same cup as Jesus, as he was the first of the twelve apostles to be martyred. His death is the only death of the twelve recorded in Scripture (Acts 12:1-2).

The Commemorations

July 28: *Johann Sebastian Bach, died 1750; Heinrich Schütz, died 1672; George Frederick Handel, died 1759; musicians* - These three German-born musicians have done much to enrich the life of the church. Schütz was an early master who focused on settings of biblical texts. Bach wrote over 300 cantatas along with works for organ and instrumental pieces, and has been called the "fifth evangelist" for the way he proclaimed the gospel in music. Handel's great work, *Messiah*, is a setting of scriptural texts.

July 29: *St. Mary, St. Martha, and St. Lazarus of Bethany* - Friends of Jesus, Mary and Martha are remembered for the hospitality of their home that they offered him—Martha focused on serving their guest, and Mary on listening to him. Their brother Lazarus was raised from the dead as a sign of the greater resurrection to come.

July 29: *St. Olaf, King of Norway, martyr, died 1030* - Considered the patron saint of Norway, Olaf went from a life of piracy to becoming Christian and declaring himself king of Norway. He revised the laws and tried to administer them fairly. Driven from Norway in a rebellion, he was killed in battle trying to regain his kingdom.
