## Accent on Worship

*So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. (2 Corinthians 5:17-19)*

This weekend I was walking in my neighborhood and reflecting on this part of Paul's letter to the church in Corinth. I wanted to be thinking about the newness of creation; the flowers that will grow, the birds that will return, the sunshine and warm weather that awaits, but my mind was distracted. Distracted by how much trash the melting snow exposed, as if I needed another reminder of the disconnect between humanity and creation.

I was angry and frustrated, and the anger continued to grow, until I turned a corner and saw three neighbors walking up and down the streets gathering trash and attempting to recycle what they could. Their caring actions softened my heart, and my perspective changed. Because it was 60 degrees and I was walking in sandals, I expected my surroundings to be filled with the newness of Spring that my soul craves. But the reality is that the transformation and reconciliation that Spring brings is only just beginning. It is too early to expect the newness of Spring my soul was anticipating, but my neighbors reminded me that we have an active role to play in this transformation.

David Hurd is widely recognized as one of the foremost church musicians and concert organists in the United States, with a long list of awards, prizes, honors, and achievements, and immeasurable expertise in organ performance, improvisation, and composition.

David Hurd is the composer of dozens of hymns, choral works, settings of the liturgy, and organ works published by a number of major houses. From 1998 to 2013 he was music director and organist at Church of the Holy Apostles (Episcopal) in New York City. He is now organist and choirmaster of the famed Church of St. Mary the Virgin at Times Square.

David will play a program of eclectic music with improvisations.

And the truth is that when we see this love and care reflected in others, it transforms us again and again to join in the work to bring forth the new creation, the reign of God in our daily lives, here and now.

## Nowruz Gathering

The spring equinox for Minnesotans means that the cold days are coming to an end, and the warmer days of summer are soon to follow. For the Afghan family sponsored by Mount Olive, these days offer the opportunity to celebrate Nowruz, the New Year festival observed throughout central and western Asia. Not unlike

the New Year holiday that Americans celebrate, it is a time to gather with family, eat traditional foods, and look forward to new beginnings.

The name “Nowruz” is a combination of two Persian words meaning “New Day”. It is an ancient celebration, rooted in Zoroastrian practice. Traditional spring foods such as lamb, spinach (whose green color represents new life), and stewed fruits grace tables laden with food. Even the rice that accompanies these foods is often scented with cardamom and cumin, fragrant spices that symbolize nature’s awakening after a dark winter.

This year, the Alight organization ([wearealight.org](http://wearealight.org)) sponsored a Nowruz gathering for Afghan women, some of whom are new to our community, and others who are well established here. It was a great day of feasting, dancing, talking, and simply making new friends. For the young woman in the family with which we’ve been working, it was the first time she had met other Afghan women since coming to the Twin Cities. Judy Hinck was privileged to accompany her to the festivities and reported that “she was smiling from ear to ear”.
