This Sunday we'll sing with the psalmist: "Surely, our heart rejoices in you, for in your holy name we put our trust. Let your lovingkindness, O LORD, be upon us, even as we place our hope in you." (Psalm 33:21-22) And then we'll hear from the preacher of Hebrews: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1)

These are times when, on any given day, we might find it hard to hope for . . . well, anything. Our struggles as a society are well-documented, and the threat to our nation's democracy is real and urgent. Meanwhile, millions of our neighbors are crushed in the middle, and it's hard to see how any of them, or we, can hope for better.

But God's Word says, find trust in God, and in that trust, hope will emerge. Can you trust the God whose love for you and me and the whole creation was worth dying for, and whose love can never be taken from you or me, or any of God's children, or this creation? The God whose resurrection life is even now moving you and me and so many to care and work for God's justice and mercy in this world?

Can you find trust that you are God's beloved? That all humans and all creatures and this weary planet are God's beloved? If you can, then hope is yours. Such a God will surely keep holding you and me and all God's children and the whole creation in love, and help us bring healing.

Trust leads to hope. God give us all both.

Partner of the Month: Every Meal

Every Meal (formerly known as Sheridan Story) coordinates the delivery of food to families struggling with food insecurity through partnership schools throughout Minnesota during the school year. When children have breaks from school, including spring breaks, in the winter, and summer, Every Meal works with schools and other community organizations like the YMCA to continue food distribution to families. Pre-pandemic, Mount Olive volunteers partnered with Jefferson Community School to distribute food to children attending that school for their families. We are currently assessing what our volunteer involvement with Every Meal will look like in the future.

Mount Olive has chosen to support each of our Partners of the Month though a yearly contribution from our budget, but on top of that, we encourage any member who wishes to contribute over and above our budgeted amount to those partners doing work in their areas of passion and concern. Mount Olive is connected to the NPHC-MSP through Irene Campbell.

Locally, they are holding a school supply drive. We will be collecting school supplies THIS WEEK ONLY in support of their metro-wide effort. Please bring any school supplies you wish to donate to Mount Olive until Sunday, August 7.

The most needed school supplies include: colored pencils, composition notebooks, crayons, erasers, glue, glue sticks, highlighters, loose leaf paper (college-ruled), markers (washable, regular and thin), pencils (#2), pencil pouches (3-ring), pencil sharpeners, pens (red, black, and blue), pocket folders, post-it notes, rulers, scissors, Scotch tape (regular and double-sided), Sharpies (fine point, black), tissues, watercolor paint sets, both wide-ruled and narrow-ruled spiral notebooks.

Church Picnic Fun

Over 100 people, including many new Afghan friends, enjoyed food and fellowship under beautiful skies and warm temperatures. A crack grilling team made up of Pr. Crippen, Walt Hinck, Matt McCuen and Dan Hellerich served up burgers. Halal food and birthday cake for the Afghan family was provided and served by Judy Hinck and the Global Ministry team. Jim and Judy Johnson and their house guest, Oleksii, graciously transported chairs and tables to and from church, and others stepped up to do whatever was needed to make the day a success.

Help with Live Streaming

We are in need of a couple more volunteers to run the live stream during worship. You'll need to be comfortable using technology, but most importantly, follow along with the liturgy and switch cameras in anticipation of what's happening next.

What you'll do as a live streamer: Get situated at the computer in the South Gallery, and start the live stream a minute or two before the prelude begins. Follow along with the liturgy, and when we come to a transition point (e.g. a reader walks to the lectern, or a hymn is about to begin), you press a couple



buttons to switch to the correct camera, move camera positions, and/or display overlay slides with music on them.

Training sessions & written directions are available. And an experienced streamer will sit by you and assist you for your first services. With the addition of a couple more volunteers, each of us would be scheduled once per month or so.
