# Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Mount Olive is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. It is a community in and of the city where all are welcome in every aspect of congregational life. An elevator to the lower and street levels can be found at the northwest corner of the education wing. Restrooms are located on the main floor and lower level. **Helps for following the liturgy:** Numbers marked with the word “page...” in small case are in the front portion of the hymnal at the bottom left and right corners of the page. Numbers marked with the word “HYMN...” are in the back portion of the hymnal in the upper left and right corners of the page. Note that the psalms are numbered as hymns 1-150.

**Hymns 901-1100** are found in the purple hymnal supplement, *All Creation Sings*, and are indicated as “ACS HYMN ...”

## Focus on the Season: 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost, Lect. 23 C

Called to contemplate the cost of discipleship today, we encounter Paul’s dear friend Philemon, who faces a cost he might not have anticipated when first he learned to follow Christ. Paul’s gentle yet insistent reminder might be a less threatening way than Jesus’ intensity to get our attention about following. But both are clear: to live in Christ is life, but it also costs.
