## Accent on Worship *Interim Pastor Paul Hoffman*

### *An Embarrassment of Riches*

Throughout the Christmas season, the sweeping and beautiful words of the prologue to John's Gospel washed over us. Among those words are this lovely reminder from verse 16: And from God's fullness we have all received, grace on top of grace.

In these weeks following Epiphany, the lectionary reveals to us some of that fullness, one grace piled atop another. This Sunday, the gifts will fall upon us like manna from heaven. Here's a preview...

"...do justice, love kindness, walk humbly with your God"  
Micah 6:8

"...the message about the cross is foolishness"  
1 Corinthians 1:18

"...God's weakness is stronger than human strength."  
1 Corinthians 1:24

And as if that weren't already enough grace served up, from there we plunge into the beginning of Jesus' teaching ministry with the opening of the Sermon on the Mount, The Beatitudes.  
Matthew 5:1-12

One of the hazards of such beautiful and sweeping passages of Scripture is that they are just that - beautiful, sweeping, and familiar. Familiar words can make it difficult for us to stop, look, and listen. How do words spoken by an ancient prophet, a first-century evangelist, or our Lord himself speak to us?

## Additional Live Streamers Needed

We are in need of a couple more volunteers to run the live stream during worship. You'll need to be comfortable using technology, but most importantly, follow along with the liturgy and switch cameras in anticipation of what's happening next. It is important work, giving those who can not be with us in person the ability to join us in worship.

What you'll do as a live streamer: Get situated at the computer in the South Gallery and start the live stream a minute or two before the prelude begins. Follow along with the liturgy, and when

we come to a transition point (e.g. a reader walks to the lectern, or a hymn is about to begin), you press a couple buttons to switch to the correct camera, move camera positions, and/or display overlay slides with music on them.

Training sessions & written directions are available. And an experienced streamer will sit by you and assist you for your first liturgies. With the addition of a couple more volunteers, each of us will be scheduled once per month.

What are the riches of God's ever-accumulating grace for followers of Jesus like you and me in these cherished yet familiar words?

One of the things that strikes me about each of these texts is just how filled they are with paradoxes. Micah contrasts empty sacrifice to the fullness of a humble walk with God. Paul challenges us to grapple with God's wisdom pitted against that of the world. And Jesus wastes no time in introducing us to his ministry of unexpected reversals. He teaches of a new creation in which the meek, the merciful, and the pure in heart reap endless blessing.

Something here is calling us to die to familiarity so that Jesus can raise us up to new insights and strength for a life in service to the world. I'm looking forward to liturgy with you on Sunday in which God will once again reveal to us the endless well of grace on top of grace.

**January 29:** “*Christian Nationalism: What is it and Why Now?*,” presented by David Engen. Christian Nationalism is front and center in the political turmoil which seems to define our national conversation today. David Engen will present the ideologies at the center of this political movement and how it runs counter to what defines the Christian faith. We will look at it considering scripture, Luther, and contemporary writers – those supporting it and those in opposition.
