The women went to the tomb early Sunday morning. Together. The disciples were gathered all weekend in the upper room. Together. Jesus gathered them together on Thursday night for Passover, and though they fled at his arrest, Peter and John stayed outside where he was tried. The women and at least John were with him at the cross. Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus buried him together. Jesus felt forsaken by God at the cross, but in the mystery of the life of the Trinity, even then he was not alone.

This is a week we learn the path of Christ is not a solo, individual journey. If Jesus and those first followers couldn't walk this week alone, neither can we. We gather together every day this week so we can live in this shape of God's love for us together.

It's what I missed most on sabbatical. Joseph the pastor was able to step away without anxiety about all of you. I knew that Paul and Mollie would handle any pastoral concerns beautifully, that David and Jim and Cha and Jose would do their usual gracious ministry with this congregation, that the amazing leaders amongst all of you would do what you always do and serve God faithfully here. I had three months without the weight of the pastoral office and cares.

But Joseph the person missed you, my community. A lot. Worshipping elsewhere isn't the same, not because of the way worship was led but because I didn't know people there. I didn't feel at home. I missed my church family.

April 16 - "Homelessness, Housing, and Mount Olive"

Homelessness and issues related to affordable housing have been in the forefront of many of our minds for months if not years now. More and more, members of our society are starting to recognize housing as foundational to many of the other issues faced by member of our community, including financial security, addiction, education, and more. In this adult forum, Coordinator of Neighborhood Ministry Jim Bargmann will facilitate a panel discussion with several members of our community who have experience with homelessness and are doing work in making housing a reality for all.

April 23 - Cynthia Prosek: "Restorative Justice Community Action"

RJCA has provided a community-based approach to criminal prosecution with the mission of fostering individual growth while strengthening communities through restorative justice practices. RJCA serves both youth and adults referred by the City of Minneapolis, Hennepin County and Ramsey County. Rooted in indigenous practices, restorative justice focuses on the transformation of individuals, repair of relationships, and community building while addressing harm in the community.

The Lake Street Council is a non-profit organization built to support the diverse community of residents and businesses that call Lake Street home. They do this though a variety of programs that support entrepreneurs starting new businesses, grant programs to help existing businesses thrive, work to beautify the streetscape, and engage local businesses in policy work that affects the corridor. The Lake Street Council has been instrumental in helping local businesses, many of them family and BIPOC owned, recover from the civil unrest of 2020, giving out 5.5 million dollars in grants to over 300 businesses.
