Accent on Worship

It is a privilege to write on our Gospel lesson for this upcoming week. A passage we often title "the walk to Emmaus" is a story I can read over and over again and find something new with each reading.

Much has been said and written about this passage, much of it raising questions and offering conjecture. How and why did Jesus keep himself from being recognized by the two companions? Who were these two - Cleopas is named, but what about their companion? Some have hypothesized that the unnamed companion was female, perhaps even a spouse, but the reality is we don't know. Typically detailed Luke is silent on the matter. What of Jesus' question, feigning ignorance of the events of the past week? As someone with a background in education, this one I can understand! Educators frequently ask questions of students to which they certainly know the answer, helping to guide the learners into self-realization rather than lecture, which often leads to a higher level of understanding and retention. But I digress. And what of Jesus' interpretation of the passages of Scripture about himself, reduced for us to one simple sentence, one verse? How much would I love to know the content of that conversation!

I will share this: one significant thing I took from this passage many years ago is the image of walking with Jesus in conversation. This image has shaped my own prayer life in more profound ways than nearly any other teaching and I would welcome conversation about this at any point.

But this week, I find myself drawn to verse 32, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?"

How many of you share this experience? How many of you have been in liturgy and felt an overwhelming sense of God's presence - a burning in your heart? Perhaps while singing a hymn or hearing a sermon or chanting the words of a psalm. Or maybe you felt it when approached by someone seeking help? Or while reading scripture during a moment of quiet devotion? Or while conversing with God in prayer? These I have come to recognize as the work of the Spirit. I think it very intentional that for all the things Luke could have told us about this encounter, he did include this detail. I believe this is not all that uncommon of an experience.

Dear friends, please trust the Spirit's work. Know that she knows what she is doing! Perhaps she is offering encouragement in a dark time. Perhaps she is offering a new insight into scripture and its connection to your life. Perhaps she is leading you to something new, a calling to action even. Along with prayer, time in scripture, conversation with trusted, faithful companions, we can trust this burning, trust the work of the Spirit, just as it seems Cleopas and their companion did along the road.


Book Discussion

Upcoming Education Topics

April 23 - Cynthia Prosek: "Restorative Justice Community Action" (RJCA) has provided a community-based approach to criminal prosecution with the mission of fostering individual growth while strengthening communities through restorative justice practices. RJCA serves both youth and adults referred by the City of Minneapolis, Hennepin County and Ramsey County. Rooted in indigenous practices,

restorative justice focuses on the transformation of individuals, repair of relationships, and community building while addressing harm in the community. RJCA's program provides a forum for referred participants to be accountable for their actions by meeting with stakeholders (direct victims, supporters, and community members) to address the harm and create a shared solution that repairs the harm to the extent possible. This approach reduces the barriers to a criminal conviction and provides the opportunity for a second chance. It also empowers individuals to broaden their awareness of the impact of harm in communities, make new connections, and contribute to the well-being of their community.

Meet with RJCA staff to learn about Restorative Justice practices and how this alternative to traditional punitive responses to behavior increase community safety and well-being.

They do this though a variety of programs that support entrepreneurs starting new businesses, grant programs to help existing businesses thrive, work to beautify the streetscape, and engage local businesses in policy work that affects the corridor. The Lake Street Council has been instrumental in helping local businesses, many of them family and BIPOC owned, recover from the civil unrest of 2020, giving out 5.5 million dollars in grants to over 300 businesses.
