The Mount Olive book group has been meeting once a month for 20 years, usually on the second Saturday from 10am to noon.



April Neighborhood Ministry Partner of the Month: Lake Street Council

The Lake Street Council is a non-profit organization built to support the diverse community of residents and businesses that call Lake Street home. They do this though a variety of programs that support entrepreneurs starting new businesses, grant programs to help existing businesses thrive, work to beautify the streetscape, and engage local businesses in policy work that affects the corridor. The Lake Street Council has been instrumental in helping local businesses, many of them family and BIPOC owned, recover from the civil unrest of 2020, giving out 5.5 million dollars in grants to over 300 businesses.

Mount Olive has chosen to support each of our Partners of the Month though a yearly contribution from our budget, and often, like our partners this month, we also volunteer in support of their work. On top of those financial and labor contributions, we encourage any member who wishes to donate over and above our budgeted amount to those partners doing work in their areas of passion and concern. Each year our grounds and gardens are tended by volunteers from our congregation. Not only does this make our property an oasis in the neighborhood, but it gives the volunteers a chance to practice dirt therapy.

The work begins with an initial clean-up day on Saturday, May 6, from 9:00 am to noon, and then continues through October on the first and third Saturdays from 9:00 am to 11:00 am. Join us for an hour, a day a month, or on every workday as your schedule allows you to participate. In addition to cleaning up and tending of the grounds around the church and the pollinator garden in the south parking lot, we will be taking on some special projects this year. Those projects include cleaning up and removal of partially dead bushes and ground cover in the north parking lot and mulching, splitting the lilies and grasses on the south side of the church, and trimming bushes and trees across the property.

Bring your own hand tools if you have them. If not, we have a few extra garden tools available.
