We're in the party season!

I suspect you've heard it said many times: Easter is more than a day. In fact, it is a "week of weeks" – seven weeks of celebrating the resurrection – celebrating who we are as Easter people of God. Personally, I enjoy observing various religions with similar cycles – a period of introspection followed by celebrations which "remember" and rehearse who they are: Ramadan and Passover, to give two examples. It's possible that many of our "religious" observances might have had different origins, such as a harvest festival in ancient times being adapted and transformed into something new such as the Triduum for Christians. Whatever the case, we do have a way of celebrating as Christians that reminds us that death does not have the last word: Christ is risen! (Notice the verb tense there...)

Like any good celebration, we put our best efforts forward if what we are celebrating is of high value – the best china and flatware, linens, and we cook feasts with love and grace to share together – all bringing us as community together in what we believe in common. Christ is Risen! We no longer fear death.

After hosting a feast for friends or family, it makes sense that we get kind of tired. In the Cantorei, I call it a "happy tired" – grateful for the experiences with no regrets for all the work. Sure, we could use paper plates (figuratively), not worry about formalities, do things in a less expensive or extensive manner, but what would that say about how important the values are that we are celebrating?

So for seven weeks leading up to Pentecost, we celebrate. We "wear ourselves out" with songs of joy and praise during this time. The entrance rite includes two songs – the opening hymn, and then the hymn of praise, "This Is the Feast." We sing as the Gospel Procession carries the Good News to be read in the center of the assembly, and then again as the procession returns. We sing almost all of the responses in the Great Thanksgiving. There are a lot of full-bodied, exuberant songs/hymns to sing during this time and we sing them whole-heartedly!

Then, there is the genius of the liturgical year: about the time we're reaching the point of being done with the extreme party, we arrive at "Ordinary Time" and things settle back down. Perfect.

In the meantime, four more weeks of celebrating. Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

Book Discussion




Align Minneapolis Furniture Drive at Mount Olive

Affordable Housing and Homelessness Adult Forum Follow-Up

On April 16, in our Adult Forum, we had the opportunity to hear from six members of our community connected to the related issues of affordable housing and homelessness. A plethora of topics to discuss and the incredible knowledge of our guest speakers meant we ran out of time and were not able to address questions submitted by you, the audience. After our time together, though, I did submit your questions in writing to our guests. Two of them have responded, Katie Dillon, Executive Director of Align Minneapolis, and David Hewitt, Director of Housing Stability for Hennepin County. Come One, Come All – It's Garden Season!

Each year our grounds and gardens are tended by volunteers from our congregation. Not only does this make our property an oasis in the neighborhood, but it gives the volunteers a chance to practice dirt therapy.

The work begins with an initial clean-up day on Saturday, May 6, from 9:00 am to noon, and then continues through October on the first and third Saturdays from 9:00 am to 11:00 am. Join us for an hour, a day a month, or on every workday as your schedule allows you to participate. In addition to cleaning up and tending of the grounds around the church and the pollinator garden in the south parking lot, we will be taking on some special projects this year. Those projects include cleaning up and removal of partially dead bushes and ground cover in the north parking lot and mulching, splitting the lilies and grasses on the south side of the church, and trimming bushes and trees across the property.
