
"<sup>18</sup> so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, <sup>19</sup> and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power."

#### - Ephesians 1:18-19

What images come to your mind as the Apostle Paul writes to the Ephesians? With words such as "glorious inheritance," "immeasurable greatness," and "great power," I imagined cartoons where characters were sitting on comical amounts of gold coins, treasure, or being crowned to rule over a kingdom. Despite knowing that a pile of gold coins is not our Triune God's promises, I was surprised that those images came to my mind first.

So what does God really want for us? What if we changed some words-such as riches, to abundance; inheritance, to presence; and power, to deeds? Which means we are instead hearing the Apostle tell us that he prays for the people to have enlightened hearts so that they may have hope, abundance, be present with God, and work for God's deeds.

So instead of money or power, God wants us to have hope in our world and live in a way that connects us with God. Not as glamorous or exciting as the cartoon images, but for our world that we know is in deep need for God's presence and promises-peace, love, and caring for one another sounds like the best treasure one could ever find.

### Tuesday Noon Bible Study Link




