Singing as ... hospitality?

Yes. I've written about this before, but it's the kind of thing that needs a boost from time to time.

Singing is one of those unusual things the church does. These days there are very few places where people are comfortable singing in public. My all-time favorite is "Happy Birthday" – people are willing to sing that even if there is no piano, director, of if they don't think they are singers (few actually do) – they just sing from the heart to the person to whom it's directed. It may not be as polished as professional singers, but that's hardly the point. Coming from the heart, wishing that person well on that special day is the point.

Yet, here in church, we sing. And we sing a lot. It might even comprise more than 50% of the time we spend together as an assembly at worship. That's a lot!

When YOU sing out, doing so not only gives you the opportunity for deep expression from within to God and each other, it also encourages those around you to join in. Most people's fear is that they would stick out, or sing an intentional solo, so a half-mumble becomes safest. But in a community where singing is strong, it's so much easier to enter in without that fear. And once that gets started, in only grows as more and more people enter in without fear.

In addition, there are many of us who read music (far more than popular culture would lead us to believe). Here is an additional responsibility – for the sake of those who do not read, your help is especially needed – to keep that "critical mass" of voices singing who can read what we are to sing. That carries everyone into the song even more.

We've sung a lot of unusual things here – some fairly complicated things, such as the Bach setting of the Sanctus. We need that singing to be strong – because of why we're singing it in the first place ("...with the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn ..."), but to help those with less training/reading/singing abilities – and they do get it and find it as meaningful as you do. You readers, for example, can help keep the Lord's Prayer moving – keeping half-notes two beats and not more, which can slow it all down.

So, be encouraged to sing! And pass on that encouragement – through your singing.

Mid-year Financial Update

Through the end of May, Mount Olive has received more than \$311,000 in contributions towards our operating fund, which is 22% more than the contributions we received during the same period in 2022. Our operating fund expenses through the end of May totaled over \$400,000. When we factor in additional income that we received, we have a deficit through May of more than \$82,000. While it is not unusual for us to be running a deficit at this time of year, the size of our current deficit is historically large.

We continue to be blessed with incredible generosity at Mount Olive. Please prayerfully consider whether you can help close this year's gap over the remainder of the year.

Looking Ahead: June 18 and 25:

"The Priestly Culture as Taught in Hebrew Scriptures," presented by Hamline University Prof. Emeritus Earl Schwartz.

We are once again very privileged to have Earl Schwartz join us in the Chapel Lounge for one more Sunday, June 25, following the 10:00 AM liturgy.

Earl has been with us before and responses to his presentations are always to bring him back as often as possible. This time Earl will present on the "priestly culture" as presented in the Hebrew scripture which he calls "the underlying 'life force' basis of purity, impurity, and sacrifices." He will explain how Israelite versions of these practices, as described in biblical texts, do and do not appear to resemble similar non-Israelite practices, and then, how the prophetic tradition came to re-contextualize this all in distinctly biblical ways.
