"At that time Jesus said, 'I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father, and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.'" - Matthew 11:25-27

There is a beautiful simplicity to the workings of God's reign.

This past week, we heard about the significance of the seemingly insignificant act of sharing a cup of cold water. This week, Jesus even names it - God chooses to reveal the things about their reign to even infants - yes, literal babies - but also children or any who are considered insignificant by society.

This teaching isn't a new or unfamiliar theme for Jesus. The "blessed are" instructions of what we have come to know as the Beatitudes provide simple instruction about the simplicity of God's reign. Birds, seeds, crops, flowers, water - all these things too provide simple yet deep illustrations of how what the reign of God looks like - both now in its imperfect incompleteness and in its future fulfillment.

There is certainly a wonderful depth to Scripture and its teachings, and all of this is worth studying. Learning about the cultural dynamics at play, original languages, the practice of translation and its effects on our understanding of God's Word

are all worthy pursuits that can further illuminate and expand our understanding of Scripture.

But do you know the really fascinating thing about all of these practices - at least from my experience? The more I study and learn about Scripture, my study leads me to strip away my cultural biases, years of historical baggage, and unfortunate misunderstandings - leaving me with a much more simple message of God's love, expressed through Jesus' actions and the work of the Holy Spirit and though the people I meet every day. A beautiful simplicity that may just involve learning about cups of cold water, birds, seeds, flowers, water, and those considered blessed from those sometimes considered unimportant or insignificant.

A beautiful simplicity, for sure.

Mid-year Financial Update

Through the end of May, Mount Olive has received more than \$311,000 in contributions towards our operating fund, which is 22% more than the contributions we received during the same period in 2022. Our operating fund expenses through the end of May totaled over \$400,000. When we factor in additional income that we received, we have a deficit through May of more than \$82,000. While it is not unusual for us to be running a deficit at this time of year, the size of our current deficit is historically large.

We continue to be blessed with incredible generosity at Mount Olive. Please prayerfully consider whether you can help close this year's gap over the remainder of the year.

Global Ministry: EPES helps immigrants at Chile's northern border

ELCA missionary Karen Anderson, who works with EPES/Popular Education for Health, writes that many people in Chile are experiencing "disappointing and difficult times." One reason is the defeat of a proposed new constitution that would have significantly expanded social rights to health care, education, and social security.

Another is a humanitarian crisis along Chile's northern border with Peru — a crisis that in some ways is a Southern Hemisphere mirror image of what's happening at the U.S.-Mexico border. An estimated half-million immigrants, about one-third of them Venezuelans, have found their way into Chile in the last four years. They include some 180,000 Haitians, who often face both language barriers and prejudice.

The situation at the Chile-Peru border — in the Atacama Desert, where it's winter — is described in the May issue of EPES's newsletter: "Since mid-April, 300 mostly Venezuelan, but also Haitian, Colombian and Ecuadoran, migrants and refugees, with backpacks, infants in strollers, and light bags, have been stranded along the sandy wayside of the highway that cuts through the desert. Chilean military are lined up behind them, Peruvian police ahead of them. They are not allowed to remain in Chile or to enter Peru."

Since early in 2022, both EPES and the ELCA have supported Asamblea de Migrantes y Promigrantes (AMPRO), which helps immigrants in Iquique and Arica, cities in northern Chile. AMPRO provides emergency resources to immigrants, prioritizing women with children.

EPES is one of ten global ministries supported by Mount Olive Lutheran Church.
