Turn it in the light

"I will open my mouth to speak in parables; I will proclaim what has been hidden from the foundation of the world." (*Matthew* 13:35, *quoting from Psalm* 78)

Jesus taught in parables to reveal what has been hidden. Even though last Sunday's parable of the Sower and this Sunday's parable of the Wheat and Weeds include an allegorical explanation, probably added after Jesus' time, Jesus' parables are not meant to have one singular meaning.

Jesus was perfectly capable of teaching directly and clearly. But he often spoke in parables, which aren't clear. They're jewels to be looked at in all kinds of light, turned to see new things. The best thing to do with Jesus' parables is to listen. Imagine. See if there is something new to find.

Be ready, though. Counting last Sunday, there are 20 Sundays left in the Church Year, and 12 of the Gospel readings in those 20 will include parables of Jesus. Now's the time to get your ears and heart and mind ready to be open to what Jesus is showing.

Because that's really the gift of his parables. They show an image of something hidden in God's heart, in God's reign, and invite you to take that image up to the light and ponder. Each parable can have multiple meanings to see. Maybe you'll see something no one else has before.

To those who have ears to hear, let them listen, Jesus liked to say. So let's listen together. Imagine. Be open. There is grace to encounter, wonder to grasp, truth to lean on, in these images and stories. Come, Holy Spirit, and open our eyes and ears and hearts to your truth.

Global Ministry: EPES helps immigrants at Chile's northern border

ELCA missionary Karen Anderson, who works with EPES/Popular Education for Health, writes that many people in Chile are experiencing "disappointing and difficult times." One reason is the defeat of a proposed new constitution that would have significantly expanded social rights to health care, education, and social security.

Another is a humanitarian crisis along Chile's northern border with Peru – a crisis that in some ways is a Southern Hemisphere mirror image of what's happening at the U.S.-Mexico border. An estimated half-million immigrants, about one-third of them Venezuelans, have found their way into Chile in the last four years. They include some 180,000 Haitians, who often face both language barriers and prejudice.

The situation at the Chile-Peru border — in the Atacama Desert, where it's winter — is described in the May issue of EPES's newsletter: "Since mid-April, 300 mostly Venezuelan, but also Haitian, Colombian and Ecuadoran, migrants and refugees, with backpacks, infants in strollers, and light bags, have been stranded along the sandy wayside of the highway that cuts through the desert. Chilean military are lined up behind them, Peruvian police ahead of them. They are not allowed to remain in Chile or to enter Peru."

Since early in 2022, both EPES and the ELCA have supported Asamblea de Migrantes y Promigrantes (AMPRO), which helps immigrants in Iquique and Arica, cities in northern Chile. AMPRO provides emergency resources to immigrants, prioritizing women with children.

EPES is one of ten global ministries supported by Mount Olive Lutheran Church.

Sexton Support Needed

With the resignation of our Sexton, we have a need for volunteers who can assist with light cleaning, building opening/closing, and set up for events until we are able to fill the position. The light cleaning involves emptying trash and recycling, cleaning bathrooms, dusting, vacuuming, and mopping floors.

Set up assistance would be required for special events and involves moving tables and chairs. Opening and closing the building, known as a building keeper in the past, involves ensuring that on Sundays the building is properly opened, secured at the end of the day, and that there is someone in addition to the ushers watching the Parish House and entrances during the service. 
The August market will be held in our South Parking lot. Mount Olive is also supporting the market with the use of our tables and chairs.
