# Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Mount Olive is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. It is a community in and of the city where all are welcome in every aspect of congregational life. An elevator to the lower and street levels can be found at the northwest corner of the education wing. Restrooms are located on the main floor and lower level. **Helps for following the liturgy:** Numbers marked with the word “page...” in small case are in the front portion of the hymnal at the bottom left and right corners of the page. Numbers marked with the word “HYMN...” are in the back portion of the hymnal in the upper left and right corners of the page. Note that the psalms are numbered as hymns 1-150.

**Hymns 901-1100** are found in the purple hymnal supplement, *All Creation Sings*, and are indicated as “ACS HYMN ...”

## Focus on the Season: 10<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost, Lect. 18 A

In Isaiah God invites all who are hungry or thirsty to receive true food and drink without cost, to stop grasping for things that cannot satisfy. When thousands sought food, Jesus fed them and satisfied them. But he did this with the help of the disciples, who now realize they are part of God’s mission as much as Jesus is. As we eat and are satisfied at the Table of Christ, this also dawns on us: we are sent as bread for the hungry, always empowered with Christ’s abundance.

## **The Commemorations**

**August 8:** *St. Dominic, founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), died 1221* - Dominic was a Spanish priest who saw the wealth of the clergy as a stumbling block for the church, so he formed a movement, the Order of Preachers (commonly called Dominicans) devoted to itinerant preaching and living in poverty.

**August 10:** *St. Lawrence, deacon, martyr, died 258* - As one of the seven deacons of the church at Rome, Lawrence was responsible for the church's financial matters and for the care of the poor. Asked by the emperor to gather the church's treasure, he presented a collection of orphans, lepers, and the like. The enraged emperor had him put to death.

**August 11:** *St. Clare, Abbess of San Damiano, died 1253* - A contemporary of Francis of Assisi, Clare and a growing number of companions established a women's Franciscan community, called the Order of Poor Ladies, or Poor Clares. She inspired other women to pursue spiritual goals.
