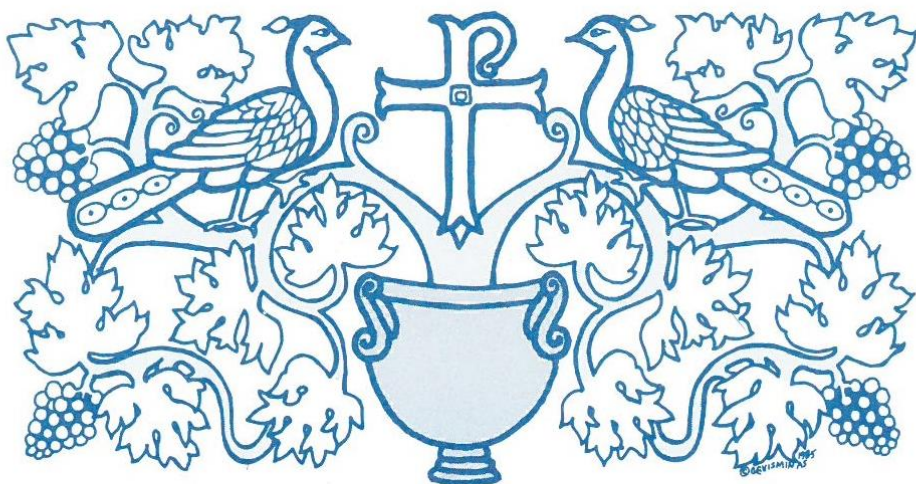

The pall which is placed over the urn is a reminder of the white garment ✠ Clyde ✠ put on at his baptism, a sign that in baptism we are clothed with the righteousness of Christ, our hope in life and in death. The Paschal candle is a symbol of Christ's presence, granted through his saving death and resurrection, for Jesus' resurrection has now become ✠ Clyde ✠ new and eternal life.

AT THE ENTRANCE TO THE CHURCH

(Please stand and face the entrance to the church when the bell sounds.)

☐ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the source of all mercy and the God of all consolation, who comforts us in all our sorrows so that we can comfort others in their sorrows with the consolation we ourselves have received from God.

☑ **Thanks be to God.**

☐ When we were baptized in Christ Jesus, we were baptized into his death. We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

P Eternal God, maker of heaven and earth, who formed us from the dust of the earth, who by your breath gave us life:

C **We glorify you.**

P Jesus Christ, the resurrection and the life, who suffered death for all humanity, who rose from the grave to open the way to eternal life:

C **We praise you.**

P Holy Spirit, author and giver of life, the comforter of all who sorrow, our sure confidence and everlasting hope:

C **We worship you.**

P To you, O blessed Trinity, be glory and honor, forever and ever.

C **Amen.**

As the hymn begins, the urn is sprinkled with water, recalling Clyde's baptism into Christ, and the congregation is also sprinkled.

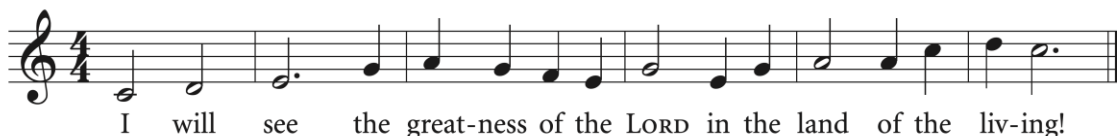
FIRST READING: Isaiah 40:25-31

GRADUAL HYMN *(standing to face the cross as it is carried into the assembly)*

Stanzas 1-2 are sung before the reading.

Stanzas 3-4 are sung following the reading.

HOLY GOSPEL: John 13:31-35

Response after the announcement: **☩ Glory to you, O Lord.**
