Alternatively, you can also place an order for the supplies you wish to purchase from Target for delivery direct to Mount Olive or you can donate funds to support this effort. The most needed school supplies include: colored pencils, composition notebooks, crayons, erasers, glue, glue sticks, highlighters, loose leaf paper (college-ruled), markers (washable, regular and thin), pencils (#2), pencil pouches (3-ring), pencil sharpeners, pens (red, black, and blue), pocket folders, post-it notes, rulers, scissors, Scotch tape (regular and double-sided), Sharpies (fine point, black), tissues, watercolor paint sets, and spiral notebooks (both wide-ruled and narrow-ruled).

#### Sexton Support Needed

With the resignation of our Sexton, we have a need for volunteers who can assist with light cleaning, building opening/closing, and set up for events until we are able to fill the position. The light cleaning involves emptying trash and recycling, cleaning bathrooms, dusting, vacuuming, and mopping floors.

Set up assistance would be required for special events and involves moving tables and chairs. Opening and closing the building, known as a building keeper in the past, involves ensuring that on Sundays the building is properly opened, secured at the end of the day, and that there is someone in addition to the ushers watching the Parish House and entrances during the service. #### Supporting our Neighbors

**August 13 – 4:00 pm – 7:00** – Southside Shtetl is a market celebrating Jewish culture and art. It is named "Southside Shtetl" to pay homage to the small Jewish villages in pre-Holocaust Eastern Europe. The markets began a year ago by one of our neighbors on 31st and Elliot and have become point of coming together in the southside Jewish community.

The August market will be held in our South Parking lot. Mount Olive is also supporting the market with the use of our tables and chairs.

#### August Neighborhood Ministry Partner of the Month: Every Meal

Every Meal (formerly Sheridan Story) coordinates the delivery of food to families struggling with food insecurity through partnership schools throughout Minnesota, providing food for weekends, winter breaks, and summer breaks when children no longer have access to free and reduced-cost meals at school. Prior to COVID, Mount Olive volunteers partnered with the staff at Jefferson Community School, distributing food to children every Friday afternoon. The leadership and volunteers connected to Every Meal are currently accessing our future involvement and what that will look like going forward.

Mount Olive has chosen to support each of our Partners of the Month through a yearly contribution from our budget, and often, like our partners this month, we also volunteer in support of their work. On top of those financial and labor contributions, we encourage any member who wishes to donate over and above our budgeted amount to those partners doing work in their areas of passion and concern. You can do this using your offering envelopes or our online giving system. All additional contributions to our partner of the month will be distributed to the partner for the month in which the contribution is received.

#### **Rice Street Gardens**

In late April, Mount Olive received a letter from Pastor Dana Nelson of our sister congregation, Galilee Lutheran in Roseville. Through that letter, we first heard about a remarkable place called the Rice Street Gardens. The Rice Street Gardens is a 2.5 acre plot of land that has been divided into 266 plots that then are leased at very low cost to families, 70% of whom are from the refugee and immigrant population. In fact, according to



Pastor Dana, 10 separate languages are regularly spoken in the Gardens. Many of those caring for plots at the garden came to the United States with backgrounds in agrarian cultures and now find themselves living in multifamily housing - meaning the Gardens provide the only means for preserving a lifestyle that is very much a part of their being. In addition, over the past 8 years, since the founding of the Gardens, many signifiant relationships have been built and continue to develop.

Currently, the land used by the Gardens is leased to the non-profit organization set up by Galilee Lutheran to manage the property. That land is now up for sale. Galilee Lutheran is working to raise funds to purchase the land so that the Gardens, and those using the land, can continue to thrive. They have been seeking partnerships with area businesses, individuals, and fellow faith communities. Following a recommendation from the Neighborhood Ministry Committee, the Vestry of Mount Olive has approved a gift of \$3000 from the Mount Olive Foundation allotment in support of Galilee's hoped-for purchase of the garden property.

If you are interested in supporting this work as well, you are invited to do so. Donations can be given to Mount Olive with a note on the memo line that the donation is to be directed to the Rice Street Gardens. And, **this Saturday**, **August 5 from noon to 4:00 pm**, there will be a celebration at the Gardens. The Mount Olive community has been invited to join this celebration. Parking will be available at Galilee Lutheran, 145 North McCarrons Boulevard in Roseville.
