Word of God, Word of Life

You may have noticed that we're reading the Scriptures in liturgy from a binder instead of a book. Since August 6, we've been using the updated version of NRSV, with emendations, that Augsburg Fortress is publishing, not yet printed in a book.

A history of the use of the New Revised Standard Version (1989) and the background and rationale of this new update and the emendations **can be read in this document** from Augsburg Fortress. The texts we're using are based on the 2021 update of the NRSV, along with emendations made by Lutheran scholars Gail Ramshaw and Gordon Lathrop.

The Worship Committee decided to use these versions of the texts to ever more clearly speak God's Word into our worship. Translation is always a matter of interpretation, both of the original language and the new one, as much art as science. A poet in English might use a word with multiple connotations, making the poem rich and beautiful. If you speak English. Translators have to pick one of the multiple connotations and that shapes the way the poem is perceived. So, as English changes, new translations of Scripture need to be prepared. Our language for humanity, for God, for differing kinds of people, for the very reign of God on earth and in heaven, is fluid and changing. These readings are biblically accurate and also inclusively and expansively proclaim God's love so people today can hear it and be blessed.

Ultimately, we long to hear God's voice speak to us and call us to life and hope for us and for the creation. It is our hope that these readings will more deeply bring God's Word into our worship and bless all who gather here.
