# Accent on Worship *Jim Bargmann*

"O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence—"

- Isaiah 64:1

Our First Reading this week begins with a prayer that ends up being way too sanitized, too peaceful, too calm, in our current usage. Not that it is not a good thing to read these words - that can have its own power - but at least in my life, these words have been shouted at God, sometimes through tears. I imagine this was how they were first uttered by Isaiah as well.

The common and familiar interpretation of the words of Isaiah 64, and likely the reason the Revised Common Lectionary has it included in the readings for Advent, is that God did indeed tear open the heavens and come down - in the person of Jesus. And similarly, in the duality of Advent, we await Jesus' return.

But when I have found myself praying for God to rend the heavens and come down, it was not in either of these contexts. Upon learning that work I loved would end because my position would be eliminated because of a deficit in the budget, I found myself screaming at God to intervene - to come down and do something. Similarly, in the midst of divorce. And again in the messiness and uncertainty inherent in navigating the family court legal system. In all of these times, I prayed for God to "tear open the heavens and come down," for God themself to intervene - because no path I could see, no action on my part, seemed to work. And I can assure you, those prayers were not peace-filled, head-bowed, handsfolded prayers.

But just the same, I also recognize that while these words were fulfilled in Jesus' coming and will again be made true with Jesus' return, we are called to be Jesus in the here-and-now. We are to be *continued on page* 2

God's presence made real in the lives of those around us. And so in a very real sense, God has torn the heavens and come down and we are the embodiment of God's presence. And so, while the messiness in many of the situations mentioned above still exists and my prayers have not changed much - I still await God's own intervention - I feel God has guided me to understanding that I have a role in being God's very real presence in the world. I find myself adding to these prayers - praying that God would reveal to me where I have the power to "make mountains quake" as Isaiah says - to affect change where it seems only God's intervention will work. Perhaps God is tearing open the heavens and coming down - working through me to do the work that needs to be done.

# LSS Refugee Services Accessible Housing Needs

Every once in a while, Lutheran Social Services reaches out with a very specific request to assist the refugee families we serve. For this request, however, they are not seeking donations (though they still love those!) or volunteers (always looking for more!). Instead, they are seeking housing connections. They have nearly exhausted all of their known leads and have two families who each need a very specific arrangement. Here are the details of what they're looking for:

- Move in date: ASAP
- 6 month to 1 year lease
- 3-4 bedroom homes/apartments
- Must be able to accommodate a family of 7-8 people
- Metro area (near bus line, easy to access groceries/pharmacy/etc.)
- Wheelchair Accessible (at least for one bedroom, and common living spaces)
- Ideally not over \$2000/month
- Property owner willing to work with a refugee family they don't have credit or rental history, but come with an LSS guarantee of payment for the first several months. We also provide income verification.

We are seeing an increase of people arriving who require accessible housing options and would love to have a list of folks with spaces that meet those requirements so we can get them into their first Minnesota home as quickly as possible!

### **December Adult Forums**

**December 3, 10 and 17:** "Credo," a three-part study presented by Pastor Crippen. This series will look at the way we declare our faith publicly in creeds in worship, how we are bound (or not) to those creeds, and what it means for our worship life and our life in the world. We'll also consider the three ecumenical creeds that our confessions and constitution claim are our heritage and part of our foundation, at their strengths and weaknesses, and consider their use in our liturgy. Additionally, we'll explore the growing field of alternate creeds.

## **Continued Youth Justice Conversation**

At the end of August, the Neighborhood Ministry Committee hosted a conversation with younger members of Mount Olive on the topic of justice. We facilitated a conversation with a small group of those in our younger generation about what they would define as justice, what they are currently doing to work for justice, and which aspects of justice work they would like to pursue in the future.

All those who were a part of that conversation, along with any other 11-18 year olds, are invited to join us to work on further developing these ideas and making them reality. That conversation will happen on Sunday, December 10, at 12:30 pm. Lunch will be provided.
