Grasshoppers matter

"Have you not known? Have you not heard?" Isaiah says next Sunday. God sits "above the circle of the earth." The heavens are like God's curtains, stretched out, like God's tent, set up for God's dwelling. There is no one to compare to God, Isaiah says, no one who is God's equal. And if God is this large, this universal, what must the people of this tiny planet be? Well, Isaiah says, we're grasshoppers. God is so great, so vast, so eternal, we're just little grasshoppers. And our rulers, princes, leaders? Isaiah says they're uprooted plants, floating on the wind, transient. Kind of makes one feel a little insignificant, doesn't it?

So, Isaiah says, yes, God is above all, greater than all. But then the prophet promises that even these little grasshoppers of humans on this tiny planet on the edge of the galaxy matter to God. God pays attention to the weak, the faint, the weary, the exhausted. These are the ones God strengthens and lifts up.

We might be insignificant in the big picture of the universe. It's good to remember that. But have you not known? Have you not heard? God loves the insignificant. God gives us significance in a love that death cannot destroy. Those who wait for God's healing, they will find it. That's your promise and hope.

January 2024 Vestry Meeting Summary

The beginning of the meeting was focused on discussing the budget. Several Vestry members had questions, which led to a longer discussion. The plan is to share specific information about this with the congregation in the near future.

Pastor Crippen was not present, since he's on vacation. However, he asked the vestry to approve a vicar program for next year.

Property Report - Hail damage: Information gathered by the Property Committee indicates that the flat roof on the building needs to be replaced, due to hailstorm damage.

Issues with the slate roof are being looked at, also because of hailstorm damage.

The Director of Education has resigned due to a need to step back from this time commitment. The Vestry appreciates all of his good work, including the great Adult Forums which are scheduled through May.

There's been a recommendation to make a little change in the Vestry meetings and begin each one with a specific restorative practice.

Cantor Cherwien expressed his appreciation for his staff Christmas gift from the congregation. He also reports that he'll be doing more frequent music ministry with the greater church community.

Vicar Mildahl also expressed appreciation for her staff Christmas gift from the congregation. She reported progress on the Library project.

The Global Ministries Committee reminded us of the Taste of Israel and Palestine, which will take place on Feb. 11. It will be a time of learning, sharing and understanding.

January Neighborhood Ministries Partner of the Month: Our Saviour's Community Services

Our Saviour's Community Services, a non-profit founded by our sister congregation, operates a shelter, which in the last year has served a vital role in providing housing for those experiencing homelessness who have recently been released from the hospital. In addition, they provide transitional housing for women who have experienced domestic abuse and permanent supportive housing for men and women who live with a mental illness, physical disability, and/or substance use disorders. In addition, Mount Olive volunteers provide meals at the Our Saviour's shelter once a month.

Mount Olive has chosen to support each of our Partners of the Month though a yearly contribution from our budget, and often, like our partner this month, we also volunteer in support of their work. These branches will be burned on Shrove Tuesday (February 13) to make ashes for this year's Ash Wednesday liturgies on February 14.



Join us in the Luther Seminary library where Cody Sanders will reflect with us on his book *Christianity, LGBTQ Suicide, and the Souls of Queer Folk.* Isaac Horwedel will respond, and there will be time for questions and further conversation among the gathered community. "LGBTQ+ people have long experienced spiritual stress, religious trauma, and soul violence from and within Christian communities. Yet, queer and trans people have also lived fiercely and faithfully in face of these realities in ways that defy a single story of the relationship between LGBTQ+ people and Christian faith," writes Sanders. His talk will reflect back with us on his book while also imagining forward to an upcoming keynote address he will present at the Loma Linda University Biopsychosocial-Spiritual Research Conference on spiritual trauma in the LGBTQ+ community. You are invited to be in dialogue with him about his work and its implications for Christian community and the practice of ministry.
