■ For daily renewal of the spirit of true joy which your abiding presence alone can give, that all the joys of our life may be made holy in you,




■ For the right understanding and use of the means of grace, so that we, having been washed in living water, may grow in grace and hunger for righteousness,




■ For a deep indwelling of the Holy Spirit, that we may be taught to truly live for others, calling them to the life-giving waters of the font,




L For a profound sense of joy as we experience again the salvation given to us in Holy Baptism during this year's celebration of the festival of Our Lord's resurrection,
