Easter: Spring

Spring has to be my favorite season. Nature all around us in the Northern Hemisphere is waking up. Trees and shrubs have that slight outline of a brilliant green as buds prepare to open. Perennials are poking through the dead remnants of last year's growth. Bugs, bees, and critters coming out of their winter slumber darkness and, yes, the days finally get longer with more light, and the temperature warms up and we can return to being outside.

Of course, the parallel to the liturgical year is striking and is quite dramatic. Advent began at the darkest and coldest time of the year for us – as if we wait in the deepest and darkest part of us, yearning for warmth, light, and new growth. Christ is born in us like seeds that also yearn for the warmth and light which provide energy so they can grow, springing to life. At Easter, light, warmth, and energy all break out with great joy. We know that the promise is there: there is new life after death, we have nothing to fear. The perennial garden teaches us that: that which seemed dead is not. Quite the contrary – just gathering new strength below in the dark of the soil.

This Sunday is already the Fourth Sunday of Easter (out of Seven). It is also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." The Fourth Sunday of Easter is ALWAYS Shepherd Sunday, with the Gospel reading from John 10, although different portions of this narrative are read in each of the three years of the lectionary. Psalm 23 is prayed all three years on Good Shepherd Sunday: "The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not be in want..."

Do you have a version of Psalm 23 memorized? As the likely best-known Psalm, it would really make sense to memorize it. How far can you get reciting it from memory? If you cannot get through all 6 verses, it's worth the work to set it to

memory. There will be times you need it when you don't expect to. I recall writhing in pain from a back-spasm, trying to recite Psalm 23 as a word of comfort and frankly, distraction. It was tough because there were so many different translations that were floating through my memory. One needs to prevail! It's a great comfort when in pain, sorrow, or despair, that God is there with us, watching over us with love and care.

So as nature wakes up, we too can wake up in joy and comfort that God is with us and watches us:

Christ is Risen. Christ is Risen indeed!

Supporting Augusta Victoria Hospital

Using your Taste of Palestine and Israel offerings and our emergency fund, your Global Ministry Committee is sending an additional \$1,000 to support Augusta Victoria Hospital, our partner in Jerusalem. Augusta-Victoria-Hospital is calling for donations to support the additional accommodation cost of patients and staff from Gaza and the West Bank, who cannot return home, and for medical supplies to treat people injured in the conflict. The hospital is offering accommodation for patients who need it, keeping the patients for hemodialysis (kidney treatment), and especially almost all the children and their families from the West Bank who receive hemodialysis in the hospital, to guarantee the continuity of their treatment. Those receiving hemodialysis need a session every other day, and if they miss it, they will die. It's a life-saving treatment. The hospital is also expanding its telehealth oncology program to assist cancer patients in both Gaza and the West Bank. April 21: "Community, Agency, & Accountability: Centering young people in Restorative Practices," facilitated by Cynthia Prosek, RJCA Executive Director, and Jena Brune, Youth Program Circle Coordinator.

What changes when we center youth voice in community and decision making? Restorative Justice Community Action (RJCA) is one of Neighborhood Ministry's supported programs. RJCA will share what they have been learning, doing, and how they have been growing as they bring youth voice forward in Restorative Practices. They will discuss three of their active youth programs: Community Conference, the Youth Restorative Justice Disposition Program, and the Restorative Practices Youth Leadership Cohort.
