What is to prevent me?

The beautiful story we hear next Sunday of Philip and the eunuch from Ethiopia is filled with wonders. Here we see that very early the first believers were looking into their Scriptures and seeing connections to Jesus, his suffering, death, and resurrection. We assume those connections, but they were found and learned (and some even taught by Jesus) in those days after Easter and Pentecost.

But the lovely center of this story is this Jewish person who is an exceedingly important official in the court of the Candace, queen of Ethiopia, but who is marginalized within his faith community because he is a eunuch. His surgical alteration made him an outsider among the Jewish people.

Yet he makes a pilgrimage to Jerusalem to worship, like a good Jewish person, and on his way back encounters both Isaiah and Philip. And his questions about the suffering servant in Isaiah, with Philip's assurance that it meant Jesus, lead him to this one question: what is to prevent me from being baptized? Even though I'm not fully acceptable among the chosen people of God, might I be baptized into the Christian community? Am I worthy?

Thanks be to God for Philip, who leaps to the occasion. There is no one outside of God's love. And nothing to prevent anyone from being washed in the waters of God's grace and welcomed into the community. Let's always keep our eyes open for those on the margins, those rejected, and welcome all with open arms in the love of Christ.
