Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Following the Liturgy

- HYMN: Numbers marked "HYMN ..." are in the back of the cranberry red hymnal in the upper outside corners of the pages.
- Psalms are numbered as hymns 1–150.
- Hymns numbered 901–1100, marked "ACS HYMN ...," are in the purple hymnal supplement, All Creation Sings.

Focus on the Season: Fifth Sunday of Easter, year C

Visions of the end time work their way into our Easter worship. A strange and wondrous vision from God instructs Peter about how wide the new fellowship in Christ might be. John's vision of a new Jerusalem suggests that beginnings and endings are tied to Jesus. In the gospel, Jesus begins to prepare his disciples for his departure by commanding them to love as a sign of their discipleship. We, too, gather this day as Jesus' end-time community, with one foot planted in this world and the other in the world to come, called to witness by our lives to God's love for all.



The Commemorations

May 18: St. Erik, King of Sweden, martyr, died 1160 - Erik is considered the patron saint of Sweden. As king of that nation, he tried to bring peace in the region, and to spread Christianity in Scandinavia. He was also known for his attempts to make fair laws and to protect those who were poor or sick.

May 21: St. Helena, mother of Constantine, died around 330 - Influenced by her son to become Christian, Helena (or Helen) lived an exemplary life of faith. She is also remembered for traveling through Palestine building churches on the sites she believed to be associated with Christ's life.

May 24: Nicolaus Copernicus, died 1543; Leonhard Euler, died 1783; scientists - These two men were both scientists who helped to explain the wonders of God's universe. Copernicus is best known for promoting the idea that the sun, not the earth, is at the center of our solar system. Euler was one of the founders of pure mathematics and contributed to many other fields.
