A great cloud

The letter to the Hebrews is a strange, beautiful sermon to a people on a pilgrimage through a challenging, frightening world. When the unknown readers first came to faith, they were on fire to serve as Christ. Then they went through a period of persecution and again, found God's strength to face that, and grew in their faith. But now, the writer says, they're stuck in neutral, blasé about their faith and about their path in this life. So the writer urges them to find the fire they had before, to once again become active and vital in their serving and life.

Sunday we hear the beautiful promise given to these world-weary Christians, that they are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses who are cheering them on. The cloud is all the saints of old that the writer has been talking about. For us it's all the saints of old and all those since their time and even those in our lives who have died and have gone before us. We cherish this promise, because it is ours. So be of good cheer. The saints of God surround you and encourage you to lay down any baggage that's hindering you, and get about running the race of faith, walking the pilgrimage path, always following Christ, the pioneer who leads the way himself and shows you your path.

In these wearying times, hold that promise like a lifeline. You are not alone. We are not alone. The cloud of witnesses, like Jesus, know what it is to be on this journey of faith. And they, like Jesus, are confident you can and will be faithful. We all will, with God's help, find rest in our tiredness and hope for our next steps.

August Neighborhood Ministry Partner of the Month: Simpson Housing

Simpson Housing is a multifaceted organization, providing an emergency shelter, single adult supportive housing, and family supportive housing across the Twin Cities metro area. They provide developmental and educational services for children of families in their family shelter program and "work across the metro area partnering with landlords and developers to find sustainable housing for families and individuals." In addition, Simpson operates the Adult Shelter Connect program for Hennepin County, providing a single point of contact for those seeking shelter throughout the county.

In 2020, Simpson began the process of raising funds to rebuild their shelter and office building to become the Simpson Community Shelter and Apartments. "Plans for the [new] five-story facility include two floors of permanent supportive housing, two floors of emergency shelter, a commercial kitchen, a 24-hour front desk, and offices and clinic space...". 
