New Display in the Library

The new display in Mount Olive's Louise Schroedel Memorial Library is "Celebrating the Hymn Writers Among Us." It highlights hymns and liturgical music created by nine people in the broader Mount Olive community and published in the two books we now use in worship: the red *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* (2006) and the blue *All Creation Sings* (2020). "Broader" here means we include not only members and staff, but also some interim or visiting musicians.

The idea for the exhibit was born early in 2024 when a member had a *je ne sais quoi* good feeling when he realized we were singing a hymn composed by a guy in his pew (some weeks later that hymn writer, Robert Farlee, left the pew for the organ bench, where he was our interim organist for a year). That good feeling that we're among hymn writers has been experienced by *many* worshipers at Mount Olive over many years.

For the display we've enlarged the bottom-of-the page type showing authors of text and music, tune names, copyright information, and meter. At the bottom of the display case is a facsimile of Paul Manz's manuscript for his best-known work, "E'en So, Lord Jesus, Quickly Come," which usually hangs in the choir room, and a handwritten copy of Susan Palo Cherwien's "O Blessed Spring," loaned by Elaine and Art Halbardier.

On the round table to the right of the display case are three plastic frames you can pick up to read: Short biographies of our hymn writers; an index that combines the indices in ELW and ACS, but only for our nine hymn writers; and easier-to-read copies of the framed works at the bottom of the case.

The display runs through January 25, 2026.

August Neighborhood Ministry Partner of the Month: Simpson Housing

Simpson Housing is a multifaceted organization, providing an emergency shelter, single adult supportive housing, and family supportive housing across the Twin Cities metro area. They provide developmental and educational services for children of families in their family shelter program and "work across the metro area partnering with landlords and developers to find sustainable housing for families and individuals." In addition, Simpson operates the Adult Shelter Connect program for Hennepin County, providing a single point of contact for those seeking shelter throughout the county.

In 2020, Simpson began the process of raising funds to rebuild their shelter and office building to become the Simpson Community Shelter and Apartments. "Plans for the [new] five-story facility include two floors of permanent supportive housing, two floors of emergency shelter, a commercial kitchen, a 24-hour front desk, and offices and clinic space...". September/October Book Discussions

There is no Israeli-Palestinian Conflict

The Global Ministries Committee is sponsoring a trip to the Holy Land for November 3-12, 2025, entitled, "Walking with Our Palestinian Partners." The purpose is not so much site-seeing as accompaniment (a.k.a. a "ministry of presence") for our partners there, Dar al-Kalima University College in Bethlehem and Augusta Victoria Hospital in East Jerusalem. Spaces remain for travelers. If you are interested, contact Judy Hinck (judyhinck@gmail.com), but do so quickly: our trip coordinator must make commitments on airline tickets on September 1.

Whether or not you plan to participate in the trip, all members of Mount Olive are cordially invited to join two evenings of preparatory book discussions, to be led by our tour director, Prof. George Heider. The first will be held on Monday, September 22, at 7:00-8:30 p.m. in the church library and will deal with two shorter books by the Rev. Dr. Mitri Raheb: Faith in the Face of Empire: The Bible Through Palestinian Eyes (Orbis, 2014) and Decolonizing Palestine: The Land, The People, The Bible (Orbis, 2023). Dr. Raheb is the founder and president of Dar al-Kalima University and is the most published Palestinian commentator on the issues facing his people. The second discussion will be held on Monday, October 20, also at 7:00-8:30 p.m. in the church library. Our focus that evening will be on the Rev. Munther Isaac's Christ in the Rubble: Faith, the Bible, and the Genocide in Gaza (Eerdmans, 2025). Pastor Isaac succeeded Dr. Raheb as pastor of Christmas Lutheran Church in Bethlehem and is increasingly noted as a spokesman for Palestinians.

So what is meant by "There is no Israeli-Palestinian Conflict?" Come to the discussions and see. But here's the heart of the matter: what is going on in the Holy Land today in no way resembles a contest between two remotely equal forces. Rather, it is a matter of dispossession, exile, and death meted out by one group on another. At least, that is the Palestinian perspective, which we intend to unpack in our discussions.

By all means, join us. If you are going on the trip, this is essential preparation. If you're not, this is essential information. The only prerequisite that we ask is that you read the books before coming.

A caregiver; whether parent, grandparent, nanny, or another loving adult, participates actively to model and engage our youngest children in singing, playing, dancing, and praying from the comfort of your home. Our hope is that the songs, prayers, and Bible stories become part of your Christian faith practice at home. Children's Choir (1st-4th graders led by Mari Espeland) and Youth Choir (5th graders and older led by Rebekah Schulz) begin on Wednesday, September 10 at 5:30 with dinner in the undercroft. Quick eaters will have adult supervised, though self-directed activities until rehearsal, which runs from 6:00-6:45 pm.

The new year of singing and learning in God's love will have some familiar plans and some new opportunities. Youth and Children's Choirs will sing together at four liturgies this year, including Christmas and Transfiguration. The choirs will sing separately at an additional seven liturgies. Choir School singers will join with their families, especially their grown-ups, to create a one-time family choir on Holy Trinity Sunday! An intergenerational choir will help us to observe a holy day that falls outside of the school year.

Mount Olive's Choir School will join with children and youth choirs from other Twin Cities churches for a Choir Festival at Hennepin Avenue Methodist Church on Saturday, February 28, 2026. Save the date! What an inspiring way for our singers to experience singing in a large choir with a centering theme of "Abounding in Hope". The 3:00 pm festival worship service that concludes the day is free and open to the public. Rebekah, Mari, and all our singers hope many Mount Olive folks will attend.

The joys of an older, beautiful, one-of-a-kind building ---

As you may have noticed, there seems to be a lot of repair and construction activity underway at Mount Olive this summer.

These projects are complete or will be within the next 30 days:

- Repair of the exterior brick and mortar on the southwest corner of the building caused by a leak in the gutter system.
- Recaulking of the large stained-glass window on the west side of the choir loft – damage caused by the leakage above.
- Removal and repair of two cracks in a stainedglass window on the south side of the chancel.
- Brick and mortar repair on the west side of the west assembly to repair a leak that is seeping down the wall.
- Striping of parking lots.
- Fixing the hardware on the door referred to as the coat room door.

The costs for these projects total just over \$16,500.

Repair of the irrigation pipe that runs under 31st street. It was cut by the crew doing work on 31st street for Verizon. Fortunately, it did NOT damage the geothermal pipes that run under 31st street! But it did require that more sidewalks be removed to verify that there was no damage. Sidewalk to be repaired by the vendor.

No cost to Mount Olive for this work!





Work that is urgent and currently being scoped and scheduled as funding is secured.

• Exterior southeast door is badly damaged due to weathering and has become difficult to secure properly.

In the last month we had unwanted visitors enter the undercroft and kitchen area. Nothing was damaged, but they did leave it in disarray. (continued on next page)

- Plan is to replace this door with another original exterior door that is located at the bottom of the steps from the upper-level kitchen. This door would be refinished and moved to the southeast corner. A new door with a clear glass window would then be put in its place.
- Adding an alarm, alarm keypad, and access control reader to the southeast door, so that it is the same as all other exterior doors used for access.

Projected cost for this project (doors and security upgrade) is \$11,500.

 Installing UV protective film on the West Assembly and East Assembly exterior windows to ensure that the valuable artwork we have in these areas is not degraded by the sun.

Cost is just under \$2,200.
