- Psalms are numbered as hymns 1–150.
- Hymns numbered 901–1100, marked "ACS HYMN ...," are in the purple hymnal supplement, All Creation Sings.





The Commemorations

August 10: St. Lawrence, deacon, martyr, died 258 - As one of the seven deacons of the church at Rome, Lawrence was responsible for the church's financial matters and for the care of the poor. Asked by the emperor to gather the church's treasure, he presented a collection of orphans, lepers, and the like. The enraged emperor had him put to death.

August 11: St. Clare, Abbess of San Damiano, died 1253 - A contemporary of Francis of Assisi, Clare and a growing number of companions established a women's Franciscan community, called the Order of Poor Ladies, or Poor Clares. She inspired other women to pursue spiritual goals.

August 13: Florence Nightingale, died 1910; Clara Maass, died 1901; renewers of society - Nightingale was born in England, and horrified her wealthy family by deciding to become a nurse. She led a group of nurses in ministering in the midst of the Crimean War and worked for hospital reform. Maass, a native of New Jersey, was also a war nurse, and volunteered as a subject for research on yellow fever. She died of the disease.

August 14: Maximilian Kolbe, died 1941; Kaj Munk, died 1944; martyrs - Father Kolbe was a Franciscan priest arrested by the Nazis and confined in Auschwitz. Kolbe gave generously of his meager resources and finally volunteered to be starved to death in place of another man. A Danish Lutheran pastor and playwright, Munk strongly denounced the Nazis who occupied Denmark in the Second World War. His sermons and articles helped to show the anti-Christian nature of the movement.

August 15: St. Mary, Mother of Our Lord - The church (including Martin Luther) honored Mary with the title Theotokos, meaning "God-bearer," for her role in giving birth to the Son of God. Her song, the Magnificat, speaks eloquently of God's lifting the lowly and feeding the hungry.

About Cantor Schwandt

Daniel Schwandt is a native of Appleton, Wisconsin, and was baptized and confirmed at Zion Lutheran Church (ELCA), in Appleton. He has his undergraduate degree in Church Music (emphasis on organ) from St. Olaf College in Northfield. In 1997 he was the winner of the Ruth and Paul Manz Scholarship Competition. He earned a Master of Sacred Music (organ) from the University of Notre Dame, and a Doctor of Musical Arts (organ performance) also from the University of Notre Dame. His dissertation is titled "A Responsibility to God and Man: The Life and Organ Works of David N. Johnson (1922–1987)."

Daniel has served as visiting musician at Mount Olive, 1999-2000, as Interim Director of Music at Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, Minneapolis, from 2000-2002, and as Organist at St. Thomas the Apostle Catholic Church, Minneapolis, from 2002-2004. He served as Cantor at Augustana Lutheran Church of Hyde Park, Chicago, from 2004-2014, while also serving as the Cantor to the Seminary Community at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago, from 2004-2016. He was Cantor at Immanuel Lutheran Church, Chicago, from 2014-2018. While in graduate school at Notre Dame he served as Music Associate at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, South Bend, Indiana, from 2018-2021, and as Director of Sacred Music at St. Thomas the Apostle Catholic Church, Elkhart, Indiana, from 2021-2022. Most recently Daniel has been the Associate Director of Music at Trinity English Lutheran Church, Fort Wayne, Indiana, from 2023 to 2025.

In addition to his service at LSTC, Chicago, Daniel has also held the academic positions of University Organist and Lecturer of Music at Lawrence University Conservatory of Music, Appleton, Wisconsin, from 2020-present, and Organ instructor at Purdue University, Fort Wayne, Indiana, from 2022-2025.

Daniel is married to Emily Bird, a conductor, educator, and singer. Emily was born in Toronto, Ontario, has her undergraduate degree in Music Education from the University of Western Ontario, and earned a Master of Sacred Music degree from the University of Notre Dame. She is the former Associate Artistic Director of the Fort Wayne Children's Choir, former Conductor of the Chamber Treble Singers and voice teacher at Purdue University, Fort Wayne, Indiana, and is currently the Associate Director of the American Choral Directors Association of Minnesota. They share a home with Otis, a two-year-old miniature schnauzer who is reportedly excellent at vocalizing his feelings about other people, dogs, or squirrels, is deeply in love with food, will do anything for a treat, and loves to join in when people are singing.
