Be Stilled

Our psalm for Reformation Sunday is 46, and it's noisy. Mountains fall into the sea, waters foam, nations rage, kingdoms are shaken. This constant refrain accents the noise: "The LORD of Hosts is with us, the God of Jacob is our stronghold." No matter the confusion and clamor of the world, God is our refuge and strength, our help in trouble.

In the presence of God.
Being the presence of God.

Yet near the end of the psalm God's voice speaks: "Be still, then, and know that I am God." In the midst of chaos and noise, God quietly says, "Be still a moment. Know I am God."

The Church cannot continue be re-formed, our congregation reformed, the world re-formed, each of us re-formed, if we cannot find the stillness to hear God. When you slow down, turn off the outside influences (news, TV, social media, podcasts, music, you name it) for a moment, when you sit quietly and ask God to calm your frantic heart and racing mind, God's voice can speak instead of all the other voices that compete in your mind and heart. In that stillness there will be moments you are aware of your breathing, of the silence. Moments you hear God saying, "I'm God, you're not. Let me still you, quiet you." And you can hear God's hope and grace.

We likely never find a permanent place of stillness in the chaos of life. But when we open ourselves to God's presence we receive moments that clarify, calm, give us refuge. We are reformed, made new again, and sent back into the chaos different, better able to live and not be overwhelmed.

Align to Learn

Harm Reduction and the Use of Narcan Wednesday, November 12, 12:00 to 1:30 pm Mount Olive Lutheran Church

Every two months, our partner Align Minneapolis, hosts an educational event for volunteers serving in the ministries of their 19 congregations.

Next month, Mount Olive will host this event and together, we will have a chance to learn about harm reduction and the use of Narcan (sometimes also called Naloxone) in the case of suspected overdose. This has been a frequently-requested topic among the volunteers at many Align congregations, including Mount Olive.

Anyone interested in learning these vital skills is welcome to attend - regardless of whether you actively volunteer within our Neighborhood Ministry programs or not.

There is no cost for this event - it is paid for by Align Minneapolis - but donations to cover honoraria for the trainers can be accepted.

October Adult Forums

- Oct. 26 The Godly Play circles will join with the Children's Choir to share with the Adult Forum their love of learning and singing about God's great love.
- Nov. 2 & 9 "Women and Divine Calling in Hebrew Scriptures," a 2-part series presented by Earl Schwartz. In this series we explore biblical texts in which a woman is referred to as a prophet, a wise woman, and/or a judge-chieftain. These passages suggest broader cultural horizons among ancient Israelites than is often assumed, while presenting many questions, including: Do these inspired and inspiring women represent a moral voice and vision associated primarily with women? If so, how might we understand this quality in light of other gender-related aspects of evolving Israelite culture, and our own?

Theological Discussion Group Resumes November 2

Mount Olive's Theological Discussion Group disbanded around the time of the Covid pandemic. It will resume on Sunday, Nov. 2, in the Library after the second liturgy.

We will read chapters 1-5 of *All Things Flee Thee for Thou Fleest Me,*" by The Rev. Emmanuel Charles McCarthy, a priest of the Eastern Rite (Byzantine) Melkite Catholic Church. Formerly a U.S. Marine pilot, lawyer, and university educator, McCarthy is the founder and the original director of The Program for the Study and Practice of Nonviolent Conflict Resolution at the University of Notre Dame. He is also founder of Pax Christi USA.

Several decades ago, McCarthy presented a conference on Christian nonviolence at Lutheran Social Service for clergy and church workers while simultaneously leading a retreat at RC St. Paul seminary. He has conducted retreats and conferences throughout the world and was nominated for the Nobel Prize for his life's work for genuine peace.

The book is available through Amazon in paperback for a little over \$15. We will read the first five chapters. Contact Al Bostelmann of you are unable to purchase the book.

Help Our Children Hear God's Love

Godly Play has been the young-child Christian education model that Mount Olive has used for over a decade now. The curriculum is modeled on Montessori educational principles where children experience a story from the bible and then pursue their own work after the story; either interacting with the story materials or using the available art supplies to create something.

Mount Olive has had a dedicated group of volunteers that have been working as storytellers and doorkeepers and sharing the stories from the bible with Mount Olive's children. The group of volunteers for Godly Play has been shrinking these last few years as people are transitioning to other roles at Mount Olive.

Mount Olive needs a new group of volunteers to take the Godly Play training and be storytellers and doorkeepers. The success of this program is dependent on new member-volunteers to be part of Godly Play. This Sunday our Godly Play Circles will be sharing a story with everyone. Mount Olive Harpsichord Ready to Play Again

In 1978, Mount Olive and Cantor Paul Manz welcomed a large new harpsichord built by Peter Tkach of Saint Louis, a gift of Mr. and Mrs. William Apell. After a number of years of use in worship and concerts, the harpsichord experienced considerable damage to the elaborate veneer finish, the soundboard and key action. The harpsichord has not been heard for many years.

After a long summer of restoration, the harpsichord is again ready to serve in worship. On Reformation Sunday, Cantor Schwandt will present a Trio Sonata (BWV 525) by Bach for harpsichord and string ensemble.

Restoration this summer included removing many sections of damaged veneer and carefully fitting and finishing new pieces to match the original. The instrument was cleaned, the soundboard repaired and a number of strings replaced. Voicing and regulating has begun to restore the original sound.





The restoration work was coordinated by Art Halbardier with much assistance from Walter Hinck, Elaine Halbardier, and Mike Knutson. Look forward to seeing and hearing the harpsichord this Sunday, October 26.

National Lutheran Choir All Saints Concert: "Lead Me Home - A Concert of Remembrance"
