Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Mount Olive is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and a Reconciling in Christ congregation. It is a community in and of the city where all are welcome in every aspect of congregational life. We believe that the liturgy is central to our life together, that our weekly gathering around Word and Sacrament strengthens us for our work as people of God in this and in every place.

Following the Liturgy

- *Page*: Numbers marked "page ..." are in the front of the red hymnal in the lower outside corners of the pages.
- HYMN: Numbers marked "HYMN ..." are in the back of the red hymnal in the upper outside corners of the pages.
- Psalms are numbered as hymns 1–150.
- Hymns numbered 901–1100, marked "ACS HYMN ...," are in the purple hymnal supplement, All Creation Sings.

Accessibility

- An *elevator* is located at the north entry. Turn right as you exit the nave.
- A large unisex restroom is located on the lower level (across the hall from the elevator).
- Primary restrooms are located on the main floor near the elevator.

Focus on the Season: 22nd Sunday after Pentecost, Lect. 32 C

In these final weeks of the liturgical year, our readings reveal our longing for God's coming and speak of God's fulfilling of all things at the end of time. Paul reminds us, as does Jesus, that speculating about when the end time will be or what things will be like in the life to come is wasted energy and time. Best we trust that God is God of the living and the dead and be comforted in that promise that "strengthens us in every good work and word."

The Commemorations

November 11: St. Martin, Bishop of Tours, died 397 - Martin's pagan father enlisted him in the Roman army. Approached by a beggar, Martin cut his cloak in half and gave part to the man, whom he later understood as representing Christ. He asked to leave the army but was jailed instead. After his release, he became a preacher, and later a bishop.

November 11: *Søren Aabye Kierkegaard, teacher, died 1855* - Kierkegaard was a Danish theologian whose writings also gave rise to the modern philosophy of existentialism. He frequently attacked the complacency of the state church of his day, as well as its desire to be accepted by polite society rather than be a stumbling block.
