Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Mount Olive is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and a Reconciling in Christ congregation. It is a community in and of the city where all are welcome in every aspect of congregational life. We believe that the liturgy is central to our life together, that our weekly gathering around Word and Sacrament strengthens us for our work as people of God in this and in every place.

Following the Liturgy

- *Page*: Numbers marked "page ..." are in the front of the red hymnal in the lower outside corners of the pages.
- HYMN: Numbers marked "HYMN ..." are in the back of the red hymnal in the upper outside corners of the pages.
- Psalms are numbered as hymns 1–150.
- Hymns numbered 901–1100, marked "ACS HYMN ...," are in the purple hymnal supplement, All Creation Sings.

- An elevator is located at the north entry. Turn right as you exit the nave.
- A large unisex restroom is located on the lower level (across the hall from the elevator).
- Primary restrooms are located on the main floor near the elevator.

Focus on the Season: The Third Sunday of Advent, year A

Jesus reveals that in God's reign the blind see, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear. We wait with patience for Christ's coming, even as we rejoice at Christ's presence among us this day: in Word and Supper, in the Church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love.





- We remember the saints who have gone before us:

 December 14: St. John of the Cross, renewer of the church, died 1591 John was a member of the Carmelite monastic order, and worked to reform it. His writings reflect a deep interest in mystical thought and meditation.

December 20: Katharina von Bora Luther, renewer of the church, died 1552 - Born to an impoverished nobleman, Katie eventually took vows as a nun, but around age twenty-four she and several other nuns who were influenced by the writings of Martin Luther left the convent. Six children were born to Katie and Martin.
