Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Mount Olive is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and a Reconciling in Christ congregation. It is a community in and of the city where all are welcome in every aspect of congregational life. We believe that the liturgy is central to our life together, that our weekly gathering around Word and Sacrament strengthens us for our work as people of God in this and in every place.

Following the Liturgy

- *Page*: Numbers marked “page ...” are in the front of the cranberry red hymnal in the lower outside corners of the pages.
- *HYMN*: Numbers marked “HYMN ...” are in the back of the cranberry red hymnal in the upper outside corners of the pages.
- *Psalms* are numbered as hymns 1–150.
- *Hymns numbered 901–1100*, marked “ACS HYMN ...,” are in the purple hymnal supplement, *All Creation Sings*.

Accessibility

- An *elevator* is located at the north entry. Turn right as you exit the nave.
- A large *unisex restroom* is located on the lower level (across the hall from the elevator).
- *Primary restrooms* are located on the main floor near the elevator.
- *Additional parking* is available on Sunday mornings behind the Career Force center at the corner of Chicago Ave. and Lake St.

Focus on the Season: Fourth Sunday after Epiphany, year A

Light shines in the darkness for the upright, we sing with the psalmist today, and the prophet Isaiah proclaims to us that when we loose the bonds of injustice and share bread with the hungry, the light breaks forth like the dawn. So, too, Jesus says we are salt and light for the world, bearing God’s goodness into the creation. This is our baptismal calling.

A Taste of Palestinian Worship: *When the group from Mount Olive visited our Palestinian partner ministries in the West Bank and Jerusalem last November, we worshipped on Sunday with the congregations of Lutheran Church of the Redeemer (Jerusalem). From time to time their English speaking and Arabic speaking congregations worship together, as they did that Sunday, and they worshipped in the chapel at Augusta Victoria Hospital, one of our ministry partners. At that liturgy, as part of the ordinary of the Mass, we sang the first stanza of “All Glory Be to God on High” and “O, Christ, Thou Lamb of God” in Arabic. Their people sang these with all their heart, as we sing them here. Today we’ll sing both of these, along with a Palestinian Christian hymn from our All Creation Sings resource, as part of our celebration of our Palestinian siblings today.*

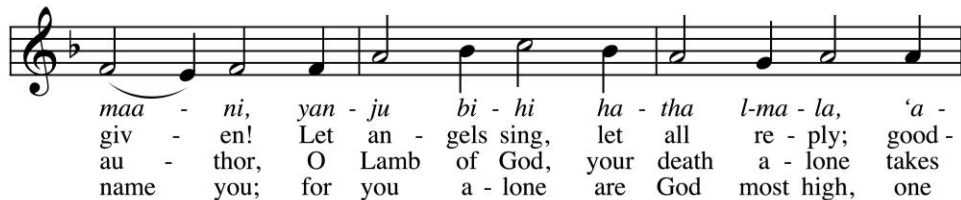

The Commemorations

February 14: *St. Cyril, monk, died 869; and St. Methodius, bishop, died 885; missionaries to the Slavs* - These two brothers from Thessalonika, Greece, were monks and were sent to bring Christianity to the Slavic people. In the course of their work they created a written language, inventing the Cyrillic alphabet for it, and translated the Bible and the liturgy.
