A Clean Heart

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me." *Psalm 51:10*

We have put away our Alleluias now, until our Easter celebration, and we turn our eyes toward Lent, and the journey of faith and life those six weeks bring us.

And the start of this is Ash Wednesday, when we hear God's call to us to repent and seek forgiveness. When we sing the song of David as he asked forgiveness from God: "Create in me a clean heart, O God." As we focus on our truth as God's children, our prayer in Lent is that God make us new inside, clean us inside and out.

That's why Ash Wednesday is such a good pivot from Epiphany to Lent. Whether we are trying to live in our call as God's light and love in the world, our Epiphany experience, or are looking to our baptismal truth and what that means for our daily journey, we need God to make our hearts clean. With our inmost being clean and looking to God, not only are our lives lived as the children of light we are, but we are able to witness to God's grace as well.

Let's pray David's prayer together in these days, that God might so clean your heart and make you the person God has called you to be, the people God needs us to be.

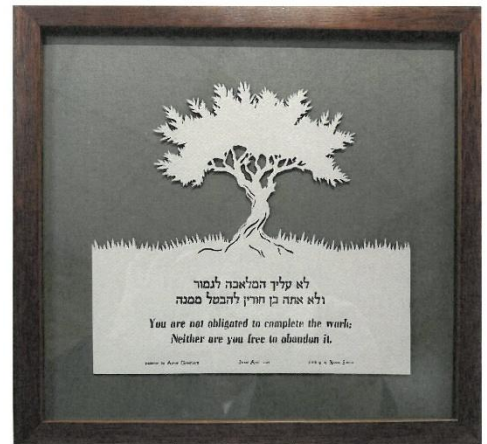

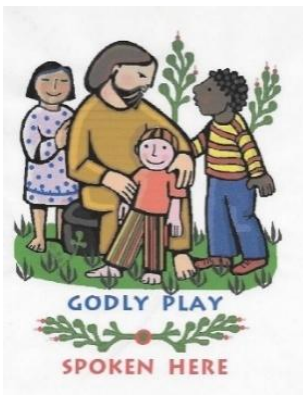

Upcoming Adult Forums

Feb. 15 & 22 – “Practicing Hope, and Not Just ‘Having’ It,” a 2-part forum presented by The Rev. Cody J. Sanders, Ph.D. Faith, hope, and love: Paul’s big three in First Corinthians 13. Why do we have no catechism for learning to practice hope? Why do we often just assume we all know what “hope” means when we invoke the subject in times of despair? These two forums will take a renewed look at hope as a practice of Christian community undomesticated from optimism, or progress narratives, or wishful thinking. We will use this conversation to begin rewilding our hopeful practice in an era of polycrisis, collapse, and despair when we need communities of hopeful practice the most.
